USDA Accepting Applications to Help Low-Income Individuals and Families Buy or Repair Homes

USDA Rural Development is accepting applications for very low- and low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area.

The Direct Home Loan program offers financing to qualified very-low and low-income applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less.

The maximum loan amount is \$20,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs. Grants of up to \$7,500 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace.

Wilmont Township Winter Snow Blowing Policy

1. Wilmont Township employs individuals from within the township that own and operate snow blowing equipment to aid the supervisors in best managing the clearing of snow that accumulates on the roadways. Persons interested in helping with this work may request to be considered and hired as the Supervisors determine the township needs.

2. When does the Township start its snow removal? The Supervisors are the persons who set the criteria for those decisions as follows:

- A. Snow accumulation of 3 or more inches
- B. Drifting of snow that causes problems for travel
- C. Icy conditions which seriously affect travel
- D. Time of snow fall in relationship to heavy use of roads.

Snow removal operations are expensive and involve the use of limited personnel and equipment. Consequently, snow removal operations will not be conducted unless authorized by the Board, based on weather, visibility, and road conditions.

3. It is not possible to keep all roads open at all times. So, which roads are the first to be opened? School bus routes, road function, traffic volume, and importance to the welfare of the community, and lastly, roads that no one lives on. Minimum maintenance roads will only be kept open as directed by the Board.

4. Roads will primarily be patrolled with the township grader. Contract blowers will be on an as needed basis (only going out when called for by the Board). It is assumed by the Board that some persons need both in and out access at most all times of the day, and this is near impossible to do. That situation will need to be addressed by his or her needs and arrange for their access to and from their homes or work.

5. Hours of work and rate of pay will be determined by the Board at the time contracts are agreed to and signed by both the Board and the contractor. Proof of liability insurance will also have to be provided by the person.

Mrs. George P. Moser, Chairlady and Mrs. Hub Slater, Vice Chairlady. Mrs. T. J. Enright will become the new Chairlady.

A larger crowd attended the annual Nobles County Sportsman's Day held here Sunday. It was rather a poor day as it drizzled most of the day. Field Trials were held in the morning and trap shooting all day. The Brewster Drum and Bugle Girls and the Worthington Drum and Bugle Corps gave their performance in the afternoon which was enjoyed by all. The ball game between Marcus, Iowa and Wilmont was one to their best games of the season with Wilmont winning the game by a score of 4 to 3. The highlights of the afternoon was the foot race of Herb Spartz, Fred Alberts, and W. J. Sievers. Herb came in first with Sievers and Alberts neck and neck until the last 20 feet when Sievers won by four inches. In the evening a cartoonist was at the pavilion and the drawing of the tickets to close the day of entertainment.

From Nobles County History by Arthur Rose

H. W. Larson, junior member of the firm known as the Wilmont Creamery Company was born in Neenah, Wis., Sept. 7, 1879, the son of A. C. and Lena (Anderson) Larson. The father, a native of Denmark, Continued...

came to the United States when a young man and located in Wisconsin, in Polk County, of which state he is now a resident at the age of 60 years. Our subject's mother, also a native of Denmark, died in Neenah, Wis., at the age of 37 years.

Mr. Larson was educated in the district schools near Neenah and in the normal school at Oshkosh. He lived near Neenah until 15 years of age and then the family moved to Freeborn County, Minn. where he took employment in the first creamery separator plant operated in the state of Minnesota, with which he was connected two years. During the next four years he was located at Hartland, Minn., where he had charge of a creamery plant. Then he returned to his home, where he worked in a creamery two and one-half years. It was in March, 1906 that Mr. Larson came to Wilmont and bought a half interest in the Wilmont creamery, of which he has since had charge. This creamery was first started in the summer of 1902 by Smith & West. There were several changes in the ownership before Mr. Larson became identified with the business, A. V. Smith of Hardwick, retaining an interest all the time, however, and that gentleman is still a part owner of the plant. Mr. Larson has added new machinery and made other improvements in the plant, and the result is an increased and increasing patronage. The creamery is one of the best in the country and has capacity for all future demands. Wherever Mr. Larson has been engaged in the creamery business he has established a record as a butter maker, and, during the years he has been so engaged, has taken a number of prizes. At the Minnesota state fair in 1900 he received third prize, and second prize at the Pan-American Exposition in Buffalo. He was awarded a bronze medal at the St. Louis Exposition, and at the Wisconsin State Buttermakers' convention in 1904 he won the gold medal on grand sweepstakes. Mr. Larson is a member of many fraternal orders. He belongs to the M. W. A., Yeomen, Odd Fellows and Masonic Orders. Of the latter order he holds membership in the Blue Lodge at Neenah, Wis., in the Royal Arch at Worthington, and in the Commandry at Luverne.

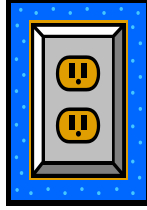
