USDA Accepting Applications to Help Low-Income Individuals and Families Buy or Repair Homes

USDA Rural Development is accepting applications for very lowand low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area.

The Direct Home Loan program offers financing to qualified very-low and low-income applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less.

The maximum loan amount is \$20,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs. Grants of up to \$7,500 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace.



Years Ago—By Audrey Brake Thanks for the many memories! Years Ago

Taken from the Sept. 17, 1942

Wilmont

Sept. 6, 1942 Rice. CA: Dear Mr. Wagner, I received your paper last week and was greatly pleased to get it, especially out here in the desert. I appreciate it much. We have a hundred squad miles of desert to do our problems and maneuvers. We are in the mountain area and can see mountains wherever we look, although some are seventy miles. away. We carry two days water supply all the time. It isn't quite so hot now, but it still get 140 degrees in these tanks. After a guy gets out of a tank at night he is one dirty mess from the dust, sand, and sweating. The soldiers are on a special diet most of the time. We are going out on a problem this weekend from Friday until Monday, and the field artillery is going to fire live ammunition over us. I don't know how long we will be here or where we will go, but I don't think it will be any hotter than here. Sincerely, Pvt. Art Hoffman Camp Gruber, Okla.

Dear Mr. Wagner, I am dropping you a line to let you know I received the weekly paper and was sure surprised. We have good mail service here, for it came two days after being published. We have fine weather here now, but the last two weeks we had plenty of rain and fog. Now we have a hot sun and dry dust. This country is no desert but awfully flat here. We have plenty of marching surface for this camp takes in 80,000 men for training. I am in the Mobile Laundry Unit and was assigned to a 11-ton laundry truck as a driver and mechanic, maybe change to something else later. I am thanking the Tribune and those who send me the paper for the home news is the boy's greatest news of today, for they enjoy reading about their friends, neighbors, and relatives and the other outside news events. Sincerely yours, Pvt. Jerome Broich

August Sieve, of Larkin Township, owns and farms the northeast quarter of section 12, and that has been his home for the last 12 years. He is the son of Joseph and Mary (Themann)Sieve, who reside near Dinklage, Oldenberg, Germany, and who are aged 70 and 69 years, respectively. August was born in Oldenberg, Germany, March 3, 1865. Mr. Sieve was raised on a farm in his native country. At the age of 20 years he began working at the miller's trade, followed that occupation a year and a half, and then joined the German Army. He served in the infantry at Oldenberg two years. Leaving the Army, he

again took up his trade and worked another year and a half. He then came to America, arriving in Baltimore on March 17, 1891. He located first at Arcadia, Iowa, where for three years he worked out on a farm. He then rented a farm near Halbur, Iowa, and conducted it two years. In 1896 he moved to Nobles County, bought eighty acres of his present farm in Larkin Township, and has since made his home there. At Arcadia, Iowa, on January 30, 1894, Mr. Sieve was married to Caroline Kohorst, who was born in Oldenberg, Germany, Sept. 23, 1872, and who came to the United States with her parents in 1885 and located in Iowa. She is the daughter of Gerd Henry and Maria Elizabeth (Wilmhoff) Kohorst. Her father died March 17, 1906; her mother lives at Arcadia, Carroll County, Iowa. Mr. and Mrs. Sieve are the parents of the following named children, all of who reside at home; Joseph Henry, born Dec. 18, 1894; Ida Catherina, born March 30, 1897; Frank Joseph, born August 7, 1898; Joseph Clemens, born Mary 1, 1901; Mary Catherina, born October 2, 1903; Anton Alois, born August 15, 1906; Emma Christina, born June 30, 1908. The family are members of the Catholic Church of Wilmont. Mr. Sieve is treasurer of school district No. 84, to which office he was elected in the spring of 1908. He served some time as road overseer.




