## USDA Accepting Applications to Help Low-Income Individuals and Families Buy or Repair Homes

USDA Rural Development is accepting applications for very lowand low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area.

The Direct Home Loan program offers financing to qualified very-low and low-income applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less.

The maximum loan amount is \$20,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs. Grants of up to \$7,500 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace.



Bernice was born on April 10, 1928, to Louis B. and Mary (Voss) Lutmer at their home in St. Kilian, MN. She was the second of six children. Bernice was baptized on April 15, 1928, at the Catholic Church of St Killian. She attended and graduated from St. Anthony Catholic School in Lismore, MN. After graduation, she joined the workforce, working at the Lismore Post Office.

On October 5, 1955, Bernice married Joseph "Butch" R. Arens and the couple moved to Mahnomen, MN, where they worked at Edna's Grocery Store and invested in wooded land which later became the family farm where they raised grain, livestock, chickens and grew a huge garden. As children, the family remembers having primarily homemade/home grown food raised on their farm. Butch and Bernice were blessed with five children: Mary, Nancy, Margie, Danny and Gail. They were married 22 years when on January 2, 1978, Butch passed away. After Bernice was widowed, she demonstrated her resilience over and over again. Her motto being, "when the going gets tough... the tough get going". At this time, she started quilting using the sewing machine which Butch purchased as a Christmas gift two weeks before he died. Over the years, she made more quilts than anyone has been able to number. She quilted until her eyesight and hands did not allow her to do so anymore. Bernice also worked at the Hartz Store in Mahnomen and in years to come the Bruggeman's Super Valu. After 20 years of employment in the grocery store, Bernice tried to retire but couldn't do it. She always said, "everyone needs a reason to get up in the morning". Bernice became the Senior Meal Site Coordinator in Mahnomen until she was 78 years old.

Over the years, Bernice taught her children life-skills by being active in the local 4-H program. She said that "4-H gives parents a reason to teach kids what they should be teaching them anyway". Bernice's highest priority was her deep faith, rooted in Catholicism, which was the guide for her life. The most meaningful work she performed was 19 years of being the Sacristan at St. Michael's Catholic Church where she organized all masses. Bernice continued to work at the church until 2017, when it became apparent that her health had changed and that she would benefit from living closer to her daughter. At that time, her resilience again shined when she moved to Lamoure, ND, and later Ellendale, ND, where she lived until the time of her passing. While in ND, Bernice continued to be productive by working in the facility where she lived.

Bernice was known by her family and friends to have great common sense, be witty, hand out words of wisdom through old sayings, have a fun sense of humor and easily made friends. Her grandchildren talk of never eating at Grandma's house without having homemade buns on the table and never leaving without being offered a jar of homemade jam.

Bernice was preceded in death by her husband, Joseph; daughter, Gail; son, Daniel; her parents; and four siblings. Left with fond memories are three daughters: Mary (Bruce) Heggen of Park River, ND, Nancy (Brian) Benshoof of Mankato, MN, and Margie (Michael) Janke of Fullerton, ND; 10 grandchildren; 17 great-grandchildren; and one sister, Audrey Reisdorfer of Worthington, MN.

A Public Funeral Mass was held at St. Michael's Catholic Church, Mahnomen, MN. Internment will be at a later date at St. Adrian Catholic Cemetery, Adrian, MN.



#### Years Ago—By Audrey Brake Thanks for the many memories!

On Wednesday morning, September 23rd, at six o'clock, Our Lady of Good Counsel Church was the scene of the wedding of Verena Bremer and Frederick Driessen. Father John Steger read the words which made them man and wife. The bride wore a pretty gold wool street length dress with accessories of luggage brown. She carried a bouquet of white roses, yellow gladiolus and baby breath. She chose as her attendant, her niece, Anna Mae Bremer. Her street length dress was of aqua blue wool, with brown accessories. Her corsage was of red roses and baby breath. The groom was attended by his brother, Melvin Driessen. Following the ceremony the wedding breakfast was served to the immediate relatives at the home of the groom's mother, Mrs. Josephine Driessen. The groom, better known as "Sam" to his many friends, has been engaged in the trucking and hardware business for the past several years. Next week he will leave for the armed forces. #### Tidbits

The U. S. Dept. of Agriculture order of Sept. 17, temporarily "freezing" all farm machinery in the hands of dealers, was necessary to insure fair distribution of available equipment and its placement where it will do the most good in wartime farm production. Farm machinery in one classification (Group A), which is scarce and especially needed to meet current agricultural needs, may be sold only upon approval by the county farm machinery rationing committee. Group A includes combines, corn pickers, disc harrows, feed grinders, grain drills, grain elevators, hay balers, manure spreaders, milk coolers, minding machines, and tractors.

#### From Nobles County History by Arthur Rose

Henry Slater, stock raiser and farmer of Larkin Township, is the oldest settler now living in that township, his residence there covering a period of many years. He owns 320 acres of land on sections 11 and 12, only a short distance south of Wilmont, and he has the home farm finely improved. Mr. Slater was born in Germany Feb. 2, 1854, the son of Henry and Dora Slater, now living in Red Wing, Minn. The father, who is now 74 years of age, came from Germany in 1854, homesteaded in Goodhue County, and has made his home there ever since. Our subject's mother is 75 years of age. For only six months did Henry Slater live in the land of his nativity. Coming to America in the year of his birth, he was raised on his father's farm in Goodhue County, Minn., and made his home there till past twenty years of age. In the fall of 1874 he came to Nobles County with a party of about fifteen men, spent two weeks looking the country over, and then returned to his old home. In April, 1875, he came out again with his father, who took a homestead of 80 acres on section 2, Larkin Township. A year or two afterwards our subject bought from Sherman Harding, of Worthington, the homestead relinquishment to the southwest quarter of section 12, paying \$75 for the same, and on that place he has resided ever since. He bought his other quarter section in 1898. During the pioneer days Mr. Slater suffered from the inroads of the grasshoppers and other annoyances of those days. But, not having sufficient means to get out of the country, he was obliged to remain and today he is in comfortable circumstances and glad that he stayed. His first home was a 10 x 12 frame shanty, and his stable was built of sods. In Chicago County, Minn., Mr. Slater was married in January, 1884 to Kellen Edelman, who was born in Germany, but who came to America when a girl. To Mr. and Mrs. Slater have been born the following named children: Otto of Browns Valley, Minn.; William, Barnard, Henry, Hubbard, Bertha (Mrs. George Miller) of Browns Valley, Minn., and Rosa. All except the two whose addresses are given reside at home. Mr. Slater is a member of the Catholic church of Wilmont. In the early days he took part in the organization of school district No. 84, and has served as a director of the district ever since. He served on the Larkin Township board for about 15 years, and has always been active in local affairs.

#### **Construction Project at Reading Elevator**

"The New Vision Board of Directors have approved several projects that will be focused mostly around safety and improvements to existing facilities. 



Lismore Cooperative Telephone is expanding internet coverage again following being awarded grant funds to expand. Lismore Cooperative Telephone Company (Lismore Broadband) expands to Iona area with FTTP GRANT of \$219,714. This last mile and middle mile project will serve approximately 100 unserved locations including 75 households, 9 businesses, 13 farms and 3 community institutions within the town of Iona. In a funding partnership with the State of Minnesota and Murray County, Lismore will improve speed levels to 1 Gbps up and 1 Gbps down on their fiber network, improving access to education and healthcare services, increasing employment as businesses leverage this network and making telecommuting opportunities accessible. Total eligible project cost is \$732,381 with local match of 512,667.
