



L. Kuhl's receive letter from Bro. in England - Dear Bro, Les, Rose, & daughter Received your letter the other day and glad to hear from you. Suppose you're anxious to hear about this country. The trip over wasn't so bad, anyway I didn't get seasick. We lived in barracks for a while but are living in tents now. Last week I saw some farmers cutting grain, and today saw a farmer threshing; but Les, you ought to see their machinery, so old and slow. Have seen a few Fordson tractors and some farmers have only one horse. The fields are all small, not more than 15 or 20 acres. The few automobiles they have are small, like the Austins in our country. They drive from the left side and on the left side of the roads, which are very narrow. Most of the people ride bicycles. As soon as I get a few days off, am going to try and go into London. Hoping you are all fine. Brother Vernon

Sam Driessen was one of the five draftees' who left for the Army Monday morning.

At the meeting held last Thursday evening at the Fire Hall, Paul Probst was elected chairman and P. J. Wagner clerk for this district for the salvage scrap metal drive, which started Monday and will continue for three weeks. Salvage pledge cards will be given out this week to all farmers in our section, which is all of Bloom and part of Wilmont Twp. and part of Larkin Twp. These cards should be filled out immediately and returned to the chairman. Bring all your scrap to the Michel Implement, as the War Board needs this metal badly.

The Fire Department was called out to the Pete Einck home Friday forenoon to extinguish a blaze which was caused from an explosion, when Mrs. Einck started a range fire with gasoline, mistaken for kerosene. Mrs. Einck only received slight burns on her hands.

The ladies will again prepare a sumptuous dinner which will include: chicken, mashed potatoes and gravy, peas & carrots, cabbage salad, jelly rolls, dark bread, and cake. 
The Mason jar, standby of home canning since grandma started 'putting up' things for the winter is another war casualty. The War Production Board has prohibited manufacture of those zinc lids for the jars. In their places, says the WPB, will be a porcelain closure with steel rim, said to be an excellent substitute that can be used with relatively little difficulty. Housewives who get along without zinc jar tops at all will be adding the war effort immensely, since the zinc will be used to make more than 35, 000 tons of badly needed brass for ammunition.

From Nobles County History by Arthur Rose 1907

Theodore Duwenhoegger, Willmont Township farmer, was born in Westphalia, Germany, Sept. 12, 1868, and is the son of the late William D. and Regina (Tigges) Duwenhoegger. The former was born in August, 1837, came to the United States and to Nobles County in 1881, lived on the Willmont Township farm unit 1894, and thereafter until his death on June 18, 1908, resided in Adrian. The latter was born in 1841, married Mr. Duwenhoegger in 1867 and now lives in Adrian. It was in the spring of 1881 that the family came across the water and settled in Nobles County. The father homesteaded the north half the northeast quarter of section 20, Willmont Township, and on that place our subject resided until he was of age. For a few years after reaching his majority, Theodore worked out as a farm hand. He farmed the home place from 1894 to 1897 and then moved to St. Kilian. With that interior village for his headquarters he spent four years on the road as the traveling representative of The Wanderer, a Catholic weekly, published in St. Paul, his territory being southwestern Minnesota, northwestern Iowa and a part of South Dakota. During the next year he engaged in the saloon business at St. Kilian and in 1902 he again took up farming as his occupation. He owns eighty acres on section 20 and eighty on section 17. He has side lines he works in addition to his farming, being agent for the St. Paul Fire and Marine Insurance Company and for the Willmont Mutual Fire Insurance Company. In St. Kilian on Nov. 13, 1894, Mr. Duwenhoegger was united in marriage to Matilda Pacholl, who was born in East Prussia Sept., 30, 1875. She is the daughter of John and Barbara Pacholl. To this union have been born the following children: Matilda Annie, Theodore William, Anton John, Emma Alphonsia, Alouise Conrad, Rudolph, Alfred, Elizabeth, all of who reside at home. Mr. and Mrs. Duwenhoegger are members of the Catholic Church of St. Kilian, and he is a member of the German Roman Catholic Protective Society of Minnesota. He served as township assessor four years, is a director of school district No. 68, with he has held six years, and is the township clerk, having been appointed in the spring of 1908.

Jim Slater called and said that he remembered the scrap iron drive in Wilmont. The iron was piled up on the open lot where the Wilmont Fire Hall now stands, which at that time was where Michel Implement (later Probst Implement) displayed and sold farm machinery. There was probably plenty of room for the scrap, since there was a shortage of farm machinery at that time. Jim's dad cleaned out an old shop and had thrown everything, not being used, in the grove. So, they went out to the grove to retrieve that and loaded it up in a 4-wheel trailer. They also went to the neighbors to get their scrap iron to bring to town. Jim also remembered that Sam Driessen sold ice in Wilmont until about 1949. A guy would deliver ice to Wilmont about 3 times a week.




Photo From the Past




