





The old phonograph records that long ago began turning out scratchy imitations of their once melodious outpourings, are going to have a price ceiling. Turned in when buying new ones, these records will bring from retailers a price of not less than 2 cents each for solid 10-inch records; 3 cents for each 12-inch record; 1 cent for each laminated 10-inch record; 1 and one-half cents for each 12-inch record and 4 cents a pound for broken record scrap. The prices are set to encourage the flow of old records because of the shortage of record shellac. Many shops require customers to turn in old records when buying new ones.


