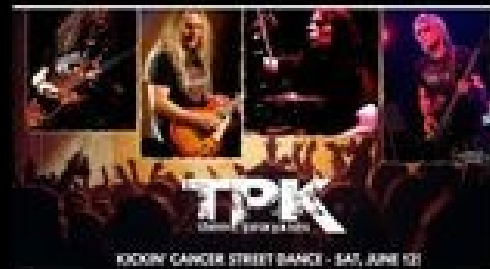

Years Ago—By Audrey Brake Thanks for the many memories!

Preparations are being made here by Air Raid Warden Chief John Pacholl and air raid wardens for a practice black-out to be held here on Friday night, December 11 from 10 o'clock to 10:30 o'clock. The practice black-out is contemplated to give wardens and residents an idea of their duties when the state-wide black-out will be held on Monday night, December 14th, from 10 to 10:20. A meeting of the air raid wardens will be held on Thursday evening of this week at the pool hall to make preparations for the practice black-out. Block wardens will then visit each one in their section to acquaint residents with black-out regulations and requirements. Homes agreeing to abide by the rules will be given a handsome "Victory V" sticker to place in the window.

Letter to Tribune: Dear Pete, Well, I hope you will excuse my long delay in writing you and thanking you once more for sending our boys from around home the paper. I know we all enjoy it. One big advantage it has over a letter is that it doesn't have to be answered. There is one boy in my room who enjoys the paper nearly as much as I do, and as soon as I have finished it, he is always waiting to read it. I am now going through Diesel School. I like it real well, only the seven-day weeks we all put in here is tough. Of course, we get to church, but have to miss breakfast to do so. Will sign off for this time. Sincerely, Raphael A. Mensen.

Another name stricken from the list of Nobles county pioneers is that of Mrs. Henry Teitenberg, who passed away at her home in Minneapolis Saturday morning, November 28, 1942. She had been in ill health for several years and confined to bed for over a year. Despite the kind and loving care administered by her daughters, Emma and Carrie, the curtains of death gently closed around her and she passed peacefully away to where trials and tribulations are no more, to the land of everlasting rest. She was of a kind and unassuming disposition and made many life long friends. Her father, G. F. Persig, was a Civil War veteran and our subject was but nine months of age when he returned from the battlefields of that war. Caroline Franke Persig was born at Red Wing, Minnesota on February 27, 1864 and at the time of her death was 78 years old. She was married to Henry Teitenberg at

Red Wing on February 10, 1886. Mr. Teitenberg preceded her in death February 7, 1920. In 1886 they came to the farm in Larkin Township upon which Marshall Killen now lives to make their home until March 1, 1900, when they moved to the farm adjoining the village of Wilmont. (This is the farm to the west of the Wilmont Baseball Diamond.) Here they made their home for the next 18 years with the exception of several winter months; spending one in Hot Springs, Ark., one in Los Angeles, Cal. and one also was spent in Minneapolis. Returning here in the spring of 1918 they purchased a residence in Worthington where they resided until the death of Mr. Teitenberg. Mrs. Teitenberg then made her home with her daughters in Minneapolis. To this union ten children were born, who are left to mourn her passing: Emma, Carrie, & Genevieve Teitenberg, Julia (Mrs. A. F. Weiss) Minneapolis, Regina (Mrs. R. A. Schneider) St. Paul, Lillian (Sr. Hortense) Toledo, Ohio, Anthony (tony) Balafon, MN, Herbert, Superior, Wis., Harriet Teitenberg, Honolulu, Hawaii, and Anna (Mrs. Thos. Cruit) Wilmont. One brother, Joe Persig of Red Wing and seven grandchildren also survive. Requiem High mass was solemnized by Rev. J. H. Steger in Our Lady of Good Counsel Church on December 2, 1942 at ten o'clock. Interment was made besides the remains of her departed husband in the parish cemetery. The pallbearers were Joseph Scholtes, Nick Bertrand, Peter Spartz, Wm. Michel, Matt Michels, and T. J. Enright.

An outstanding corn yield of 116.71 bushels per acre won the corn growing championship of Nobles County in the 1942 National DeKalb hybrid corn growing contest. Over 12,000 frames from 16 principal corn producing states were entered in this contest in which Mr. J. P. Gleis scored so well. Other county runners-up who received valuable prizes are: Henning Grann, Worthington - 108.58 bu.; Alex Ramerth, Kinbrae - 99.77 bu.; & Henry Luitjens, Wilmont - 90.02 bu.

A dinner party was given for Al Shelquist Tuesday evening in the home of his son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Gus Shelquist. The occasion was in honor of his 84th birthday.

Tidbits

From Nobles County History by Arthur Rose 1907

Herman H. Gotmer, Bloom township farmer, was born in Fayette County, Iowa, Dec. 19, 1876, the son of Henry and Gertrude (Temforda) Gotmer. Henry Gotmer was born in Munsterland, Westphalia, Germany in 1832, came to the United States about 1868, and engaged in farming in Iowa. He died in Bloom Township May 15, 1897. Gertrude Gotmer was born in Holland in 1843, came to America in 1868, and it now living in Colorado. Herman was raised on the farm and lived in Fayette County until 1891. That year the family came to Nobles County and located in Bloom Township. After renting one season, the head of the family bought a homestead relinquishment to the northeast quarter of section 22 and secured title to it from the government. On that farm our subject has lived ever since. After his father's death he managed the farm three years for his mother. Then he and a brother farmed it three years in partnership. Since 1905, Herman has farmed it alone. On Jan. 22, 1906, at St. Kilian, Mr. Gotmer was married to Tina Oaken, daughter of Henry and Lena Onken of Bloom Township. She was born in Waseca County, Ill., Jan 31, 1888. To Mr. and Mrs. Gotmer have been born two children, Martha and Henry. The family are members of the Catholic Church of Wilmont. Mr. Gotmer is director of school district No. 109, which office he has held two years.

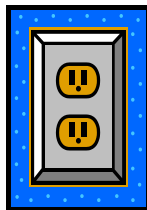
