



Years Ago—By Audrey Brake Thanks for the many memories!

A requiem high mass was celebrated at St. Adrian's Catholic Church at 9:30 a.m. Monday by the Rev. A. M. Gmeinder for Joseph J. Konz, 24, who was killed in action in the southwest Pacific. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Nick Konz, who lives north of Adrian and was inducted to the Army in Nobles County in 1941. Mr. and Mrs. Konz were notified late Saturday by a wire from the Adjutant General at Washington, which stated simply: "Joe died in action in the Solomon Islands." Joseph John Konz was born August 25, 1918 at Wadena. He is survived by his parents, four brothers, Elmer, Lester, Victor, and Luke Konz; two sisters, Lois and Sylvia Konz, all residents of the same locality north of Adrian.

The writer (Tribune editor) received an interesting letter by V-Mail from Joe Hartman this week from "Kangaroo Land" as Joe says. He gets the home town paper and enjoys it very much, even tho it is several weeks behind time. The letter was written December 28th, and that day it was around 100 degrees in the shade. It rains nearly every night, but quits in time so a fellow has to fight and kill mosquitoes and ants about an hour before going to bed, and then another half hour to get them out of your bed and mosquito bar. For amusement the boys eat watermelon and go swimming when time permits. Joe sends New Year's greeting to his friends here.

Pvt. Ray Kremer, son of Mr. and Mrs. M. J. Kremer, of Madison, Wisconsin graduated from Radio school and is going to be moved in the near future, but as yet, he doesn't know where.

Joe Vortherms of the U. S. Navy, who was home on furlough, spent a short time visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Vortherms and his sister, Mrs. Al Balster and her family. He also visited in the John Albersman home Sunday. He has returned to the Great Lakes Naval Training Station.

Bernard Kuhl, Maynard Stuntebeck, Wilbert Middendorf, and Orville Schlichte were among the draftees who went to Fort Snelling Monday for their examinations. Orville volunteered.

A few days ago Robert John Thorman. son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Thorman, Rt. 1, Wilmont, Minnesota, was a civilian, but now he is wearing the uniform of an apprentice seaman and is receiving his recruit training at the U.S. Naval Training Station in Farragut, idaho. Upon graduation he, with his Navy comrades, will either be assigned to a Navy service school for training in a specialized field or will join the fleet for early action at sea.



From Nobles County History by Arthur P. Rose 1907

William J. Kleve, of Willmont Township, was born in Festina, Winneshiek County, Iowa, June 25, 1875, the son of Anthony and Margaret (Schrandt) Kleve. Anthony Kleve was born in the town of Applehulsen, Westphalia, Germany, Feb. 14, 1836, and came to the United States in 1841. He resided at different times, in the order named, in Ohio, Kentucky, Dubuque County, Iowa; and Winneshiek County, Iowa. He was a farmer by occupation and died in the last named county Feb. 14, 1890. Our subject's mother is also a native German. She came to America at the age of 18 years and is now living in Festina, Iowa, aged 75 years. William received a common school education and resided on his father's farm in Winneshiek County, lowa, until 1895. That year he came to Nobles County and located on section 10, Willmont Township. He bought the southeast quarter of the section at that time, and in 1899 he and his brother bought the northeast quarter of the same section. Two years later our subject bought his brother's interest and became the owner of the whole half section. He continued to farm this place until 1908, when he sold, but still continued to reside on the farm. Mr. Kleve was married at St. Kilian Feb. 11, 1896 to Katie Duclos, daughter of Anthony and Barbara Duclos, of Willmont Township. Mrs. Kleve was born at St. Lucas, Fayette County, Iowa, Nov. 13, 1878. To these parents have been born the following children: Tony, born Jan. 23, 1897; Lexa, born Oct. 12, 1898, died July 30, 1899; Lexa, born April 18, 1900; Lizzie, born Oct. 27, 1902; Elsie, born April 10, 1904; William, born Aug. 19, 1905; Raymond, born Aug. 26, 1907. The family are members of the Catholic Church of St. Kilian and Mr. Kleve belongs to the C.O.F. Lodge of Adrian. For 4 years Mr. Kleve served as clerk of school district No. 65.




