

Letter from Aux. Teresa Schettler Albany, New York Feb. 20, 1943 -Mr. Wagner: You and the sponsors have received letters of thanks from the U.S. Army and Navy for the "Wilmont Tribune". Now, I, as a member of the W.A.A.C., working with the Army, want to express my thanks. The boys have said and I agree, it's just like receiving a letter from home, and there's nothing more satisfying than knowing the people at home haven't forgotten you. The trip here was very pleasant. I enjoyed it extremely as all the territory covered was new to me. This is a beautiful city. The buildings seem much older than those in the central part of the U.S., and the people treat us W.A.A.C.'s grand. They provide us with numerous entertainments, such as teas, suppers, and musicals. Then there is also a U.S.O. where we can spend our few leisure hours. The weather seems so very refreshing. We have had snow several times but not to compare with Minnesota's snowfalls. It thaws most every day regardless of how seldom the sun shines. I've been assigned to Aircraft Warning Service, a branch of the Army Air Corps. Previous to my work here, I received four weeks of basic training at Fort DesMoines, Ia. It is very much like the training of the regular Army. I hope to visit New York City in the near future; but a greater thrill would be to receive orders transferring me across. Here's hoping the people of Wilmont continue their good work towards the war. Yours truly, Aux. Teresa Schettler

The bridegroom is the son of Mr. Hans Rabenburg of Rushmore. The ceremony was performed by Rev. J. A. Rotschafer, pastor of the East Friesland Church. Geraldine Elsing dressed in peach taffeta, princess type, with matching tiara of organdy flowers, was her sister's bridesmaid. She wore pearls which were a gift of the bride. Her bouquet was of carnations and red roses. The bridal gown was princess style of white lace with a fingertip veil. She carried a bouquet of carnations and red roses. A reception was held for about 30 guests following the ceremony. The wedding cake, an angel food, mountain cake, was decorated in patriotic colors, topped with a wedding bell and 2 small American flags. The newlyweds expect to leave for Keyport, Washington the latter part of this week where Pfc. Rabenburg is stationed in Army Service.

Funeral services will be held this afternoon (Thursday) February 25th, at 2 o'clock for Clarence D. Hurlbut, who passed away Saturday afternoon, February 20, at the home of his son, Carl. Mr. Hurlbut had been ill for the past two months and quietly slept away. Death was caused from diabetes. Clarence D. Hurlbut was born January 30th, 1872 at Waverly, in Bremer County, Iowa, where he grew to manhood. On April 5th, 1897 he was married to Alice Coyer at Round Lake, Minnesota. A few years later they purchased a farm northeast of Wilmont, where the family lived for 36 years. Surviving, besides his

wife, are 12 children, one having died in infancy. They are Carl at home; Addie, Mrs. Ed Rusho at Ocheydan, Iowa; Edith, Mrs. B. Peterson of Reading; Orrin of Seattle, Washington; Jeanette, Mrs. Raymond Hindt of Worthington; Freddie of LosAngeles, California; Sadie at home; Dorthella, Mrs. Lee Hindt of Wilmont; Cpl Clarence of Minier Field, California; Alvera, Mrs. Joe Bremer of Wilmont; Alice, Mrs. John Schroer of Worthington, and Milo at home. All were here for the funeral except Freddie, who was unable to attend. Also surviving are 3 sisters in Iowa. They are Mrs. Jennie Young, Mrs. Julia Gish, and Mrs. Jesse Wilson; also 31 grandchildren. Pallbearers will be Lawrence Paradise, George Paradise, Russell Cowan, Cloyse Cowan, John Reether, and Joe Fistman. Heartfelt sympathy is extended to the family in their bereavement.
