

Nobles County Historical Society recently kicked off the public phase of its Make History at the Armory fundraising campaign.

Monies generated by the campaign will help complete the renovation of the almost-100-year-old Worthington Armory building into a new Nobles County History Center, where all of Nobles County's historic photos, records and treasures will be stored, displayed and interpreted for future generations.

Many of the renovations have already been completed, including the installation of an elevator for handicapped accessibility; removal of an acoustic tile ceiling which revealed the original wood ceiling in the drill hall; rebuilding a balcony that was removed for the gymnastics program; re-roofing both the main building and the garage addition; replacement of windows broken out in a 1990 hailstorm; refinishing of the wood floors; and a number of other projects. Three new air handlers have been installed, with a fourth system still to be funded.

The project was originally championed in September 2018 by Bob and Pat Ludlow, founders of Bedford Industries in Worthington, with an initial \$1 million gift, which was matched by \$500,000 donations each from the City of Worthington and Nobles County.

Although the pandemic hindered ensuing fundraising efforts, other benefactors have come forward with another \$1.5 million raised toward the effort.

Companies that have pledged major donations to the Make History campaign are Bedford Industries, First State Bank Southwest, Johnson Builders and Realty, United Prairie Bank and Worthington Federal Savings Bank, and a number of private donors have also offered financial support.

Now NCHS is asking YOU to consider a gift to the Make History at the Armory campaign. All donations are welcome.

There are still naming rights opportunities for larger gifts to the campaign. Pledges can be paid over a five-year time period. This may be particularly appealing to senior citizens who must take a required minimum distribution from their retirement accounts. (The IRS requires that you withdraw at least a minimum amount - known as a Required Minimum Distribution - from some types of retirement accounts annually. The distributions are required to start when you turn age 72 (or 70 1/2 if you were born before 7/1/1949).

All contributions of \$5,000 and more will be acknowledged on the Make History at the Armory donor wall in the entry to the Armory building.

A grain account has been set up with New Vision Co-Op to enable ag producers to donate grain to the project. Donating grain directly, rather than selling the grain and making a gift from the proceeds, offers significant tax savings.



Writer Receives Letter From Pvt. Louis Spartz, Monday: Dear Pete and family, I guess I'm a little slow in thanking you and the Veterans of Foreign Wars for sending me the Wilmont Tribune. I've been receiving it for guite a while now, and I sure appreciate it, especially over here in North Africa, where any news from the old home town is good news. The mail situation is rather poor at times. I haven't got any letters for quite a while now, but the Tribune seems to get through somehow. The latest one I've received up to now, was the February 28 issue. I was wondering what happened to the addresses of all the boys and yesterday I got the January 14th issue and see the reason why. Perhaps it's not a bad idea. After all we were just telling the enemy where we were at. Luckily, I saved one with all the addresses in it. I guess Paul Schissel and Lawrence Balster are over her somewhere. I met Fritz Balster on the boat on the way over. We were together up to a few months ago. Fritz and I were inducted together, quite a surprise, meeting each other on the same boat after a six-month separation. I'm at the best place now that I've been nice I'm over here. We are living in an old French Village on the edge of one of the best cities in North Africa. Air raids are quite common, but they have let up considerable in the last month. I wish you could peep in on one when she's at its height, it's one sign, sorta like a 4th of July celebration you know. I understand Minnesota had a pretty cold winter. Well, I dodged the snow for one year, but the word Africa deceives you in regard to heat. I had on all the clothes I could possibly wear and was still cold, but that was only for several weeks. We're having California weather now. I'm sure getting my share of tangerines, oranges, dates, and figs, but I'd gladly trade it for Minnesota with all its snow banks anytime. I don't believe I could ever get used to the customs of the people over here, especially these Arabs. There sure not like the book. They think you never run out of chewing gum, cigarettes, and candy. When you see how the other half of the world lives, one can't brag up the United States enough. Well, I suppose the boys are getting their fishing equipment all shied up, it's getting around that time. How is good old "Dick" Sievers, I suppose he's patiently waiting for the day. I was down to the beach a few days ago. There were a number of people fishing, but it's like so many times back home, the fishing is swell, but the catch is terrible. I didn't see them pull out a one. I'll have to try it sometime, when I'm on leave. How does the future look for a baseball team this year? I see where Johnnie Albersman and Willie Middendorf left recently. I guess there will hardly be enough left to fill all the positions. Maybe you'll have to put the barber back in a suit again. Well, Pete, there is a lot of things of interest I'm unable to write about, so I guess this will have to do for this time, thanking you again for the home town paper, which is always very welcome and wishing everybody a "Happy Easter", I remain as ever one of the boys. Letter From Boys In Service: Dear Pete: Well, I have moved from Fort Snelling, so will let you know of my change in address. Have been getting the paper regularly at Fort Snelling and hope that I don't mis any issues by being moved. This is just a new camp starting up. It isn't really an Army camp where they drill and train the men, but an interment camp for prisoners of war and Aliens. It is as you might call it, a prison with the big watch towers and the high fences. It is about 11 miles from Trinidad, which is a city of about 15,000 mostly Mexicans and Indians. The camp is set in between the Rocky Mountains and as you look off in the distance you can see the big snow-capped mountains. Had to go to the hospital the first two days I was here, as this mountain air and high altitude didn't agree with my stomach very well. It is, I believe, around 6500 feet above sea level, so that is right up there. Thanking you and the V.F.W. again for the paper, I remain as ever, Pvt. Bernie M. Kuhl Amarillo, Texas

Pvt. Francis Lais of Fort Bradly, Michigan is spending a furlough with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Mark Lais.

There will be a meeting of all air raid wardens at the Bre-zee-inn Thursday evening, April 29th at 8 o'clock. It is important that all members be present so it will be possible to check on those who have left the community, also to sign papers that will give you insurance coverage while on duty. All air rad wardens, messenger boys, and the Medical Corps, are requested to be present. A state-wide blackout will be held the night of May 7th between the hours of 9 and 11. p.m. - central war time.

The following clipping was received by Mr. and Mrs. Joe Hoffman. "The Third Armored Division of Indiantown, Penn. staged a review in honor of their second year of being formed. A building inspection of 16,000 men and officers took place on the grounds of the airport. A speech was given by the General in which Cpl. Arthur Hoffman was honored in having this truck the best maintained in the regiment. There are 100 trucks in the regiment."

Corp. T5 Milton Schroeder, who has been stationed at Camp Flora, Miss. studying heavy artillery guns, was promoted to Sgt. T4 and transferred to Camp Edwards, Mass. to study anti-aircraft guns, and was sent to Akron, Ohio for two weeks more study. He is the son of Mrs. Miller.

Mr. and Mrs. Henry Stuntebeck have received word from their sons, Pfc. Joseph Stuntebeck and Pvt. Maynard Stuntebeck, saying since their recent transfer they are stationed only 27 miles apart in the state of Tennessee. Pfc. Joseph Stuntebeck, who had been at Camp Cook, California, was transferred to Camp Forest, Tenn. and Pvt. Maynard Stuntebeck was transferred from St. Petersburg, Florida to an air base at Tullahoma, Tenn. Neither knew of each other's arrival there until they met a week later.

Mrs. Emma Middendorf received several letters the past week from her son, Pvt. Arthur Middendorf, who is somewhere in North Africa.
