USDA Rural Development has funding available for very low- and low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area.

The Direct Home Loan program offers financing to qualified very-low and low-income applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less.


The maximum loan amount is \$20,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs. Grants of up to \$7,500 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace.

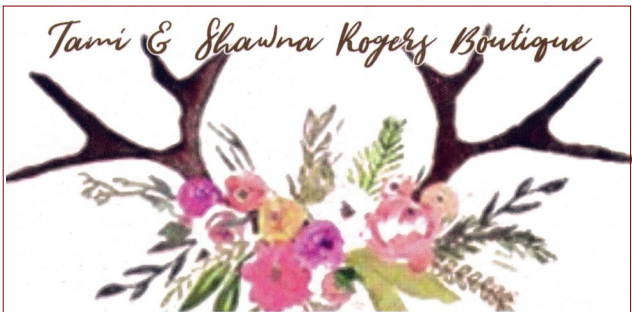

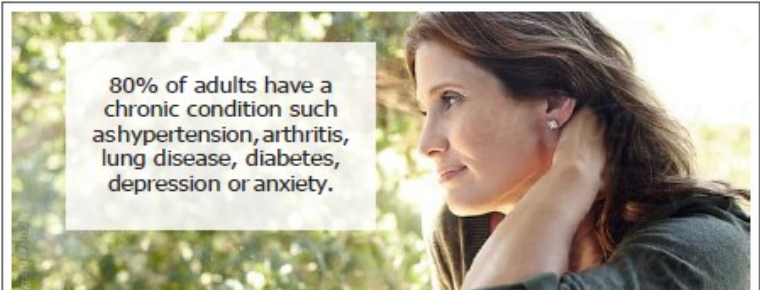

MISFIT FUN

Fun for the Misfits, who were part of the Misfit Dinner-Theater in St. Kilian from 1988 - 2016, began this past Saturday afternoon at a reunion in the school in St. Kilian. The hall was decked out with pictures and memorabilia from 27 years of performances. The afternoon started with a social time to catch up on the past 5 years since the Misfits disbanded. We also shared memories of the 27 years of time we spent as a group who worked toward a common goal and had fun at the same time.

The Misfits were from the Lismore, St. Kilian, Wilmont, and Adrian area. Through the 27 years around 60 people can say they were part of the theater group that performed 3-act comedies in the early spring of each year. It was started as a fundraiser for St. Anthony-St. Kilian Parochial School in Lismore with performances on 2 weekends. When the school closed, the Misfits kept going and donated profits to various organizations in the area.

After the evening meal, it was time to reminisce as a group. There were the pranks the Misfits played on one another on stage during the play, just to see if they could get a reaction of some kind from another actor. One prank involved wine glasses that were duct-taped to the bottom of a drawer making it difficult to take them out. Then there was the Misfit playing the part of a doctor who, instead of providing a small pill to the actor/patient, brought out a huge pill and a big animal device to help force the pill down. Various 'funny' pictures were placed in areas on stage that only the actors could see. The pranks also took place in the cast room. Everyone brought food to share while the audience had their dinner. There was a frosted sponge cake, already cut up into pieces, that was actually a yellow 'sponge'. It is still laughable thinking about one of the guys taking a bite of a piece of that cake and spitting it out with a 'baaauk'. Another time there was little, plastic fish in some cupcakes. In that room, it was 'eater - beware'!

Other memories included what the Misfits all did to get even more laughs out of the audience than what was written in the play books. One of the actors, who played a devil, wore a red outfit with a black top hat. Just before going on stage, the hat was on the actor's head and a small plastic tube was run up into the hat. Another actor blew cigarette smoke through the tube into the hat. When the devil came on stage and took his hat off, smoke rose up from his head. The audience roared. Many times laughs came from the bazaar outfits the cast wore. Then there were times the actors forgot their lines, only to have to walk back to where the prompter was to get the line, and this brought about audience laughter. Funny things even happened when the actors were out and about. One of the actors mentioned that he was at a grocery store with his wife and two young daughters. One daughter spotted the gal that was playing her dad's girlfriend in the current play and said quite loud, "Look, mom, there's Daddy's girlfriend." That was cause for a few looks from others around them.

Even those that had jobs off stage shared some of their experiences. There were the prompters that were almost at their wits end when actors forgot lines and were two pages farther in the book than where they were supposed to be. It was definitely a nerve-racking moment, but the prompters came through it and just shook their heads when that act was finally over. The dining room hosts and hostesses had their trials, too, like when an evening performance was mistakenly overbooked, but they found a way to seat and feed them. Another time a baked potato was rotten. From that time on, a few extras potatoes were made each night to alleviate that problem. The off-stage people did a great job at keeping things under control.

Besides the memories, we all said that being a part of this group was one of the best things we could have done. We developed lasting friendships, worked as a team, shared many good times, and if we had to do it all over again, it was an experience we would definitely be part of.

At these meetings plans will be discussed for securing farm help in the village to help farmers, if necessary, with special farm work such as shocking and threshing.

On Wednesday evening, May 19th, the Wilmont Pavilion will hold its opening dance of the season with Marshal DeKamp and his band furnishing the music for old-time and new-time as you like it. Be sure

and attend this dance and get your joints loosened up. Dancing will be held every week throughout the summer months.

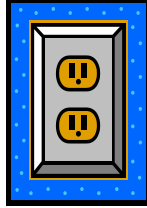
