



It helps a lot when a fellow gets the news from back home. Everything is the same here in Africa. I don't suppose you have a ball team this year. I see by the paper where all the boys that played are gone now. I haven't heard from the Iron Man for quite a while. Talk to him for me. I hope every is O.K. back there. If you have Eddie's address, please send it to me. I would like to write to him. Well, news is awful scarce, so will close for now. Here is hoping I see you all soon. Answer Soon. Say hello to Laura and Jimmy (Pete's children) for me. Your friend, Pvt. Paul Schissel

Leo O. Kuhl, son of Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Kuhl, has completed his course of studies as an aviation mechanic in this school of the Army Air Forces Technical Training Command. His graduation from this technical school now fits him for airplane maintenance and he will be sent to some air base where he will assist in keeping America's Flying Fortresses in the air for Allied victory. In addition to completion of the schedule of academic and practical studies as an aviation mechanic, he has been thoroughly drilled in military tactics and defense and a course of physical training that has conditioned him to meet all requirements of an American soldier.

Relatives and friends were shocked to hear of the passing of Herman Hebbelman on Saturday evening at his home here. Mr. Hebbelman was confined to his bed only 24 hours. He was stricken early Friday evening, death was due to infirmities of old age. Herman John Hebbelman was born January 18, 1857 at Hanover, Germany, son of John Bernard Hebbelman and Mary Kathryn Goeniger. When a young man he came to this country. On February 16, 1892 he was married to Anna Weber at St. Joseph's Church at Granville, Iowa. The lived at Granville, Iowa for several years and later moved here where they

lived in Nobles County for 33 years and were engaged in farming. In 1929 they retired from farming and moved to their home in Wilmont. To this union 15 children were born, three of which died in infancy. They are Mary, (Mrs. John Hoffman); Mathilda, (Mrs. Fredo Hartman); Joe; John, (recently released from the Army); Eleanor, (Mrs. Charles Lais); Antoinette, (Mrs. Wm. Booker) all of Wilmont; Pfc. The Wilmont Post Office has a large supply of application forms for War Ration Book No. 3, still on hand. Anyone failing to receive their card should call at the post office for one.

Ten pounds of sugar for each ration book holder has been made immediately available for home canning by the OPA. The sugar can be obtained with Stamps 15 and 16 in War Ration Book One. Each stamp is worth 5 pounds. Consumers who require more than 10 pounds per person for putting up fruits and berries may apply to their local ration boards for an additional allowance.


