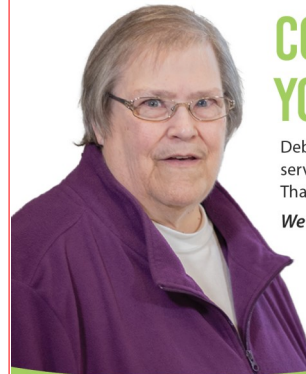

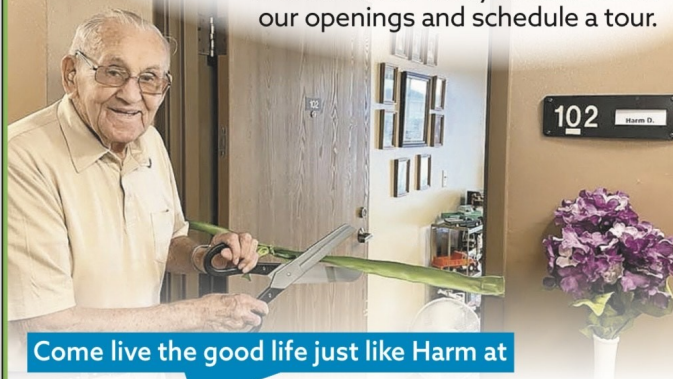

USDA Rural Development has funding available for very low- and low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area. The Direct Home Loan program offers financing to qualified very-low and low-income applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less.

The maximum loan amount is \$20,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs. Grants of up to \$7,500 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace.

Time is limited to receive funds for the current fiscal year. Contact a USDA Rural Development [Housing Specialist](#) in your area today, to see if you qualify.

USDA Rural Development loans and grants provide assistance that supports infrastructure improvements; business development; housing; community services such as schools, public safety and health care; and high-speed internet access in rural areas. ## **Years Ago—By Audrey Brake Thanks for the many memories!**

Taken from Dec. 3 & 10, 1943

Wilmont

Dear Pete, It has been my intention to write you long before this, but I just never got around to it. How is the good old town of Wilmont anyway? I often think of it and some of the 'cussions' and discussions the council used to have. I imagine most all of the young, single fellows are gone by now as is true everywhere. My season for writing this note is to get a copy of the Wilmont Tribune and secure the addresses of some of the fellows I knew real well. I know you used to have a column in your paper reserved for that purpose. I would like to contact some of them and see how they are doing. I haven't seen a soul I know since I left Fort Snelling last October. I believe there were 32 of us that left Worthington from Nobles County at the time and we were split up immediately when we got there. I was sent to a Signal Corps camp near Sacramento, California. After leaving there, they sent me to Radio school in Kansas City, Missouri. I spent 3 months there. Then they sent me to an advance radio training school at Camp Murphy, Florida. I finished there and am now located at an airfield here in Georgia and will be here only a short time. Well, Pete, if you will send me a copy of the paper that I may get some of the fellows addresses, I will appreciate it very much. Give my regards to everyone, and I will see you sometime if I am ever lucky enough to get a furlough or better still, if this war will end in a hurry. Good luck and so long. Matt Doran, Warner Robins, Georgia May 23, 1943 (If anyone has any information on Matt Doran, contact me at 507-360-1136.)

Mr. and Mrs. T. J. Enright are in receipt of a letter from their son, Francis Leo, that he was promoted from Private First Class to Technical Sergeant. Francis is in the Army thirteen months the 18 of May. He is stationed at Fort Sill, Oklahoma.

Mr. and Mrs. Joe Hoffman entertained a number of relatives at Tuesday evening dinner in honor of their son and daughter-in-law, Tech. Cpl. and Mrs. Arthur Hoffman, of Indiantown Gap, Pennsylvania, who are here on a 14-day furlough. The occasion was in honor of the couple's wedding which took place February 20th at the above mentioned place. That evening a shower and wedding dance was given in their honor at the pavilion.

Cpl. Fred Driessen of Tullahoma, Tennessee, arrived here Wednesday morning to spend his furlough at the home of his mother, Mrs. Josephine Driessen, and family and his wife.

Pfc. John Miller of Eglin Field, Florida is spending a 14-day furlough with his sister, Mrs. Lester Kuhl, and family and friends here and with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Dominic Miller at Iona.

Mr. and Mrs. Joe Hoffman entertained a number of relatives and friends at dinner Monday evening in honor of their daughter, Marie, and Pvt. Joseph Dorr. Miss Hoffman's marriage to Pvt. Dorr took place Wednesday morning at Fort Snelling. The banns of marriage were published at the Our Lady of Good counsel Church Sunday by Rev. J. H. Steger for Marie Hoffman, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Hoffman and Pfc. Joseph Dorr of St. Benedict, Iowa. Pvt. Dorr and Marie also spent several days with his parents at St. Benedict, Iowa.

Joe Albersman of the U.S. Navy came Friday from San Diego, California to spend a week-furlough with his parents, Mr. and Mrs.

John Albersman. Joe, who has been in the Navy three and one-half years was at Pearl Harbor at the time of the attack.

Aux. Teresa M. Schettler of Wilmont, Minnesota has completed a brief refresher course in the 41st WAAC Training Regiment and has been assigned to a headquarters company with which she will go to an Army post, camp, or station to take over non-combatant work. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Schettler of Wilmont

Ration Reminder: Gasoline - "A" book coupons No. 6 good from 4 gallons each; Sugar - Stamp No. 13 good for 5 lbs. through Aug. 15 & Coupons 15 & 16 are good for 5 lbs. each for home canning; Coffee - Stamp No. 24 good through June for 1 lb.; Shoes - No. 17 good for one pair through June 15; Meats - Red stamps J & K valid through June 30; Processed foods - Blue stamps G, H, & J valid through June 7.

Every community in Nobles County will close up shop on Thursday, June 17, to permit business and professional men and their employees to help with the county-wide scrap cleanup drive that day. Proceeds from the sale of this donated scrap will be used to purchase an ambulance to be donated to the Red Cross for use on one of the war fronts. A special appeal for heavy farm scrap is being issued for this drive. Farmers are being requested to donate or sell all obsolete machines. They are asked to removed from such machines any parts which they may be able to use, and then throw the rest into the scrap pile. The county goal in this drive is 1,000 pounds per farm which would mean a total of 1,000 tons for the county. The scrap is needed to keep steel mills rolling at top capacity turning out more munitions for the United Nations' offensive which is now underway.

He also disposed of the 160 acres across the road to Tom Lutterman, who purchased the south 80 acres adjoining his farm which is tenanted by his son-in-law, Joe Tammeus. Clifford Eysers of LeMars, Iowa purchased the 80 acres to the north.

Teachers, Anne Marie Davis and Ida Lou Einck, and pupils of the public school had a picnic Wednesday at the grounds.

Jack Carey, Matt Arens, and Mike Hendel drove to Omaha Saturday where they met and were accompanied home by the latter's brother, Jake Hendel of Van Nuys, California, who had arrived there last week. Relatives here were alarmed several days last week when the later, who informed them of his coming on a certain day, didn't arrive. Upon investigation they found him ill in an Omaha hospital. He had sufficiently recovered to accompany the group here Monday.

Motor vehicle Tax Stamps of the July, 1943 issue were received at the Post Office today and will be place on sale immediately. The will remain on sale until July 31, 1943. Elizabeth A. McCormick, Postmaster

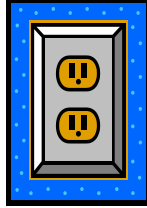

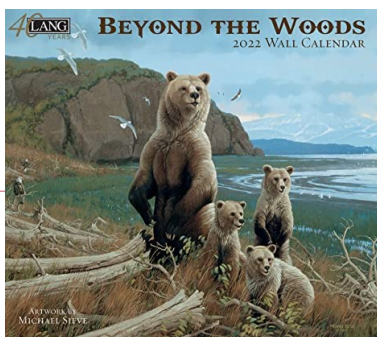
