J. H. Rogers is the manager of the Wilmont station for the Fairmont Creamery Company and deals in flour and feed. He was born in England March 6, 1856, the son of Joseph and Elizabeth (Lane) Rogers. The family came to the United States when our subject was one year old and settled in Iowa County, Wis., being early settlers in that part of the state. In Iowa County, Wis., J. H. Rogers grew to manhood and resided thirty-six years. During the last twenty years of his residence there he engaged in farming. He came to Nobles county in 1893 and for a few months lived in Adrian. He then moved to Jackson County, where he engaged in farming four years. Returning to Nobles County he located in Willmont Township and farmed five years. In 1903 he moved to Wilmont, where he purchased seven acres of land, built a residence, and where he has since resided. He became manager of the creamery station in 1906. Mr. Rogers was married in Iowa County, Wis., August 18, 1878 to Margaret Geer daughter of Edwin and Alzina Geer and a native of Illinois, where she was born July 1, 1852. They are the parents of one child, Alzina E., born Dec. 2, 1880. Mr Rogers is a member of the Modern Woodmen Lodge.


