





Years Ago—By Audrey Brake Thanks for the many memories! Taken from the January 20, 1944 Wilmont Tribune Wilmont

The following letter was received by Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Kuhl from their son, Oscar "Bud", who is in the South Pacific area. Thursday, January 6, 1944 Dearest Mother and all: I'm a long ways from the last place I wrote you, and it's been only two days, so you can see I'm getting around sort of fast. I had the pleasure of being waited on at dinner by the "Fuzzy Wuzzles". The natives of these islands are really interesting. Most of them can speak a little English. They really go for our cigarettes, gum, etc. Most of them are good workers and they do a lot for the Army. You may have seen pictures of them, well, they look just that way. While moving from place to place, I ate most of my meals in the Red Cross, believe me they are really OK. If it wasn't for them, quite a few people would go hungry. One place I stopped for a few minutes, and they were right there all ready with some cold drinks and cookies, which really went good in this heat. Talking about the heat, its terrible and the rain, its raining nearly all the time. I traveled all the way by air. Remember the last time I was in a plane was back in Wilmont one Fourth of July. This was quite a bit different, but I enjoyed it a lot. Haven't received any mail for several days, but then it'll take some time for it to catch up with receiving the fruit cake. The Wilmont Tribune is coming OK again, for a while there seemed to be some hold up somewhere or other. One day three copies came. As everything is ok here, I'll close for tonight. "Bud"

The editor had a letter from Gilbert Schneider, thanking us and the Vets for sending the paper. Gilbert was shipped to Chicago where he is studying about Special Devices which is an entirely new course in the Navy. It is a mixture of electricity and mechanics in connection with Link Trainers, and many other Aviation training devices. Gilbert says he likes the work fine.

Mr. and Mrs. John Albersman received a letter from their son, John Jr., who is now in New Guinea. It was written Christmas Day and was the first letter they had received from him since November. He said that he had received his first Wilmont paper since he was there, and it was a paper from September.

Photo From the Past

This photo, taken by the Worthington Daily Globe, is from the Nobles County Historical Society. The Historical Society made a 30 x 40 canvas print of this photo and have it hanging in the office area, which is located in a portion of the former National Guard Armory (now the Nobles County Historical Society Building). Along with this photo they have other canvas prints of other towns in Nobles County. The photo was in the July 11, 1950 edition of the Worthington Daily Globe with this caption. "Diane Voss, 4, and Judy Voss, 5, help prove that Minnesota can raise tall corn by posing beside this four-foot, eight-inch stalk on the farm of their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ted Voss, who farm a mile and a half southwest of Wilmont. The 18-acre field is remarkably even in height. The corn was planted about May 5 after the field had been treated with 3-12-12.






