This winter is nothing like the Minnesota winter, the nights are pretty chilly but during the day time it's warm and sunny. Since I've been here, it has rained once and that was some time ago. Hoping you are all well and the Wilmont paper keeps coming. I'll close. Sincerely, Bud Kuhl

Funeral services were conducted Monday morning, July 28th, at the St. Kilian Church for Mrs. Dorothea Tennessen by her son Fr. Henry J. Tennessen. Assisting were Fr. A. M. Gmeinder as deacon; Fr. Alphonse Diekmann, sub-deacon; and master of ceremonies, Fr. Joseph Davey. The sermon was given by Fr. M. J. Hiltner and singing was rendered by the men's choir of St. Kilian, being directed by Mrs. George Hebig. Burial was made in St. Adrian's cemetery at Adrian, Minn., beside her husband and son, Mathias. Pallbearers were Leo Fuerstenberg, Al Diekmann, Frank Loosbrock, Henry Henning, J. P. Gengler and J. J. Schutz. Dorothea Mary Schneider was born January 16th, 1854, vicinity of Treves, Rhine District, Germany, daughter of Mathias and Anna Mary Biersdorf Schneider. When a young child, a group of relatives came to the United States to make their home, of which Mrs. Tennessen was the last. In April 1879 she was married to John B. Tennessen at Adrian, Minn. They were the first couple to be married in the first Catholic church at Adrian. She was a pioneer of Nobles county since 1878, suffering the hardships of the pioneer days. Mr. Tennessen preceded her in death March 1, 1922. She had been ill for eight weeks and passed away Friday, July 23 at the Adrian Hospital; death being caused from infirmities of old age. In the evening, a gang of shockers from Wilmont and St. Kilian stormed the field like a hive of bees and in one hour and thirty minutes, it was all shocked. Mr. Bruns has been in poor health since early last spring and on Tuesday of last week he was taken to the Clinic Hospital at Worthington for a checkup and was brought home on Friday. Mr. Bruns is still very weak and confined to his bed. His many friends wish him a speedy recovery.

Tidbits

Prisoners of war interned in the U.S. total 65,058, the War Department has announced. Of these, 45,355 are Germans, 19,461 are Italians, and 62 are Japanese. The Japanese are interned at Camp McCoy, Wis., and the other in 37 prisoner of war camps situate in 20 states.

One tablespoon of waste household fats saved every day by each of Nobles County's 5,582 families during the second year of the WPB fat salvage campaign would provide enough glycerin to make 267,936 anti-aircraft shells, it was estimated today by the largest single collector of this vitally needed war material. Indications are that nationwide results of the campaign's initial year, ending the first week in July, totaled more than 65,000,000 pounds of household fats. This is one-third of the annual quota for the nation of 200,000,000 pounds. Minnesota is asked by the government to salvage 420,000 pounds of fats each month.
