She accompanied Ray to Langley Field, Virginia and worked in an office on the base until Ray was discharged in February 1946. They then moved to Sioux City, Iowa, where Ray attended barber college. Returning to Wilmont, Ray's hometown, the Kremers remained there until Ray purchased a barber shop in Fulda in 1953. By this time, there were four young children in the family, so Donna's work was in the home. Three more children were added to the family, and once they were old enough to be at home alone after school for a few hours, Donna began her 15-year nurse aid career at Maple Lawn Nursing home in Fulda, and retired in 1987. Ray suddenly passed away in January 1990. Prior to his passing, and after their children were grown, Ray and Donna enjoyed golfing, Canadian fishing trips, and other travels. Donna moved to the assisted living facility Maplewood Court in Fulda in July of 2012. Donna was an avid Twins fan, and during her time at Maplewood Court assembled countless jigsaw puzzles, and completed multiple search-a-word puzzles every day. She played a very competitive game of Scrabble, frequently winning, and always declared, "somebody has to win and somebody has to lose." #### Wilmont

Pvt. Louis Spartz Wounded in N. A. - The following July 25, 1943 letter was received by Mrs. Peter Gerber at Worthington from her brother, Pvt. Louis Spartz, who is in the General Hospital, North Africa. Dear Eleanor and family, I really don't know how to begin. I don't know whether to tell you a bunch of fibs or the truth. But the time for worry is over now and I am feeling pretty fair, so I guess it may as well be the truth. This is my 29th day in this hospital bed and guess I have a couple more weeks before I can start getting up. I was shot thru the stomach on June 25th, and I'll have to give all my thanks to the English Armys' efficient doctors and nurses for saving my life. It entered near the center of my back and came out about an inch above my right hip. God, I thought I'd had trouble and pain before, but I found out I didn't know what pain really was, and was a person can go through. My Guardian Angel must have really stood right over me the first three weeks for I'll never know how I battled it through. I still have pain yet, but it is bearable now. The Catholic chaplin comes to see me every day. We're good friends. I received the last Sacraments but I didn't know anything about it until he told me a few days later, so I guess I was all set for the take off. What made it so serious, it damaged my liver quite a bit. The doctors and nurses have been so good to me. I couldn't get better treatment at home. I'm writing this to you and you'll have to be my messenger. It's so hard for me to write. My Pals come to see me every day and bring me everything I want. Tell Mother not to worry, because I am not, and everything is turning out O.K. Well, so long. Love to all, Louis (P.S. Louis is now convalescing and off my "bad" books. Eating like a horse. Fr. T. Cleary, Chaplin)

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon, August 1st, at 2 o'clock at the Presbyterian Church for Charles Allen Smith, who passed away Thursday, July 29th. Rev. James Young was in charge. Pallbearers were Wm. Sievers, Wm. Michel, G. A. Shelquist, Ben Farris, Milford Davis, and Harry Clarke. Charles Allen Smith, son of John W. and Catherine Smith, came to Minnesota in 1900 and had lived near Adrain and Lismore before coming to the Wilmont vicinity in 1910. Since then he has lived on a farm near Wilmont which is operated by his father, John Smith, his brothers, Claude and Walter, and his sister, Grace. He is survived by his father; five brothers, Claude and Walter of Wilmont, Ned of Slayton; Harry of Rochester and Alva of Aberdeen, S. Dak., and two sisters, Mrs. Otto Joens and Grace of Wilmont. Burial was made in the Adrian Cemetery. Heartfelt sympathy is extended to the relatives in their bereavement.






