The lowly milkweed has become one of America's most important war time plants, Northwest War Production Board officials said today. Instead of slashing it down as a pest, Minnesota farmers are being urged to encourage its growth. The floss from the milkweed pod is going to replace kapok, the Netherlands East Indies floss that is now under Japanese control. Milkweed floss has a hollow fiber like Kapok and therefore is buoyant and resilient. It is being used as filler for life preservers and marine mattresses, airplane insulation, and thermal and acoustical insulation. Its seeds produce a drying oil, a 40 percent protein meal, with pods producing wax and cellulose. This year's goal is 1,000,000 pounds of the milkweed floss. Official buying centers will be set up in areas where milkweed grows. Bags for collection of pods and instructions for picking pods will be issued.






