The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less.

The maximum loan amount is \$40,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs. Grants of up to \$10,000 are

available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace.

August 22, 1943 Atlantic Beach, Fl - Dear Editor, I have been receiving the Wilmont paper regularly every Monday and sure appreciate it. We have nice, hot weather down here and plenty of mosquitoes. We have some back there but you really haven't seen any until you see these down here. They keep you busy hanging to something so they won't carry you away. I'm sorry to hear of the tragic accident that happened to Louie (Spartz). I hope he will soon recover and be able to come home and tell us all about it. I also wish to make an appeal to those who drive cars to pick up any servicewoman or men along the roads and give them as much of a lift as possible. I wouldn't like to hear of Minnesota treating their servicemen as they do in and around Jacksonville. They have been passing up the servicemen so much that the Commanding General made an appeal to the Chamber of Commerce to fix some way to give rides, so they have a card on their windshields which reads: "Salute for a ride." It's getting pretty sad when they haven't enough respect to pick up servicemen along the road without them having to salute them. Thanking you all again for the paper. As ever, Pfc. Cletus Broich

August 25, 1943 Camp Howze, Texas Dear Pete: Just a few lines to let you know that I am still alive and hope you are the same. Say, Pete, I had a surprise when I got back. I was made Cpl. three days before I got back. Say, Pete, even some better news, I am pulling first cook now and if everything goes good, I should be made Sgt. in two weeks. I sure hope so and then it will be Sgt. Schlichte to be. Well, Pete, it is sure hot down here. It was 128 in the shade today, not bad is it? Well, Pete, I guess I will sign off for now. Tidbit

How the home front, like the battlefront, has been mechanized is illustrated in a poster by the Highway Dept. in the State Exhibits Building at the Minnesota State Fair. In World War I less than 10% of the population depended on motor vehicle transportation. In 1918 Minnesota had one million horses and only 100,000 motor vehicles. In World War II 92% of our people depend motor vehicle transportation. In 1941 Minnesota had 904,000 cars and trucks while the number of horses decreased to 622,000. After two years of war, however, both horses and motor vehicles were on the decline with Minnesota having 579,000 horses and 765,000 cars and trucks in 1943. The minimum below which Minnesota cars and trucks cannot drop without disrupting domestic economy and impairing our war effort is estimated at 675,000. Therefore, 'if your car or truck is a necessity, conserve it - you can't get a new one.



Dr. A. B. Williams was called into the service Sept. 15, 1917. He trained at Camp Pike, Ark. as Battalion Surgeon; 347th Inf.
Departed overseas with that unit on September 24, 1918. Dr. A. B. Williams graduated from Hahnemann Medical College in Philadelphia and came to Wilmont in 1902 right out of college. In 1917 he left Wilmont to serve in World War I.
