In Memoriam-Bonita Hoffman

Bonita (Bonnie) Hoffman was born May 30, 1939, in Adrian, MN, to Olivia and Francis Bach. Bonnie Grew up in Lismore MN along with her five siblings. She attended St. Anthony's Catholic school graduating in 1957. Bonnie was a tomboy and loved animals, swimming, softball, riding horses and dancing. After the sudden death of her father, Bonnie at age 16 took on the responsibility of helping to care for her family home and three younger siblings. This experience enabled her to become an excellent cook and homemaker. Qualities she continually used to bless others throughout her entire life.

In 1959, she married Maurice (Moose) Zimmer. They had four children and moved to Appleton, MN, in 1968. During her time in Appleton she was a member of St. John's Catholic Church, she maintained a huge garden and organized her children and their friends to walk beans during the summer months. She led by example, showing her children and their friends how to have a splendid worth ethic. She went to work outside the home at B&H electronics in Appleton from 1977 until its closing in 1984.

Bonnie was married to Butch Hoffman of Holloway, MN, from 1982 to 1985. In 1986, she moved to Hopkins MN where she worked at Bakers Square as a cook. She also cleaned her apartment building complex to earn extra money. She loved to swim and enjoyed inviting friends to join her at the apartments pool. In 1990 Bonnie had another career change which took her to Brainerd, MN to begin working at Cragun's resort on Gull Lake. She worked there as a cook and liked her work. Cooking was Bonnie's favorite way to show others she loved them. She enjoyed her new position at Cragun's where she was able to meet interesting people. Many of them from other countries as Cragun's often held conferences for large companies both domestic and international.. Bonnie retired from Cragun's in 2005 and returned to a quiet life as a resident at Riverview Apartments in Appleton, MN.

Bonnie was an avid Elvis fan her entire life. She would often say "I don't believe he'd dead. I think he's living on a secluded island near Hawaii just to have peace and quiet away from people." Bonnie moved to Little Falls, MN in 2020 to be near family. She passed away on Monday February 14 2022, after a brief battle with lung cancer.

Bonnie is preceded in death by her father and mother, two brothers, one sister-in-law and one grandchild. She is survived by two sisters (Linda (Mark) Krause of St. Louis Par, Beth Spartz of Wilmont, MN, and one brother Wayne Bach of Edina MN. Four Children, Rory (Rosa) Zimmer, Pillager MN; Rhonda (Michael) O'Connor Hobe Sound Florida; Clinton Zimmer; Charleston, South Carolina; Mony (Judy) Zimmer, Little Falls, MN, 16 grandchildren and 23 great grand children. We will miss her humor and wonderful accepting nature.

A celebration of Bonnie's life was held at Lismore MN on July 16, 2022, with a graveside service at St. Anthony's cemetery.

This will give the Tribune a subscription list of well over 1000, which will reach all homes in northwest Nobles County as well as surrounding territory. Boys and girls in the services in the Lismore vicinity, as well as Wilmont, will continue to get the home paper as in the past. Miss Alfretta Balkenol of Lismore will be our correspondent, and it will be appreciated very much if the Lismore news be left with her, or be ready when she calls for it. We hope to give our readers a bigger and better paper than ever before and will appreciate all cooperation given us.

Josephine Balster, 30, daughter of Frank Balster Sr., south of Wilmont, suffered a severe chest injury late Friday while assisting with corn picking and is under observation at the Clinic Hospital at Worthington where she seems to be holding her own. This was regarded by physicians as remarkable, in view the extent of the injury, which comprised five rib fractures and a collapse of the right lung. Miss Balster, driving up to the farm buildings with a load of husked corn, got on the wagon tongue, according to relatives, to untangle the lines. Her team bolted, throwing her to the ground. Tidbits

Now, with the Army's casualty list bearing the names of more than 70,000 men, every WAC is filling an even more urgent need. She is replacing a man behind the lines so that he may go forward to fill the gap in the line left each time a soldier has been killed or seriously wounded. Minnesota alone has lost 1,484 men and a drive is now on to enlist that number of women from this state to take over the noncombatant but vitally necessary jobs formerly performed by these men behind the lines.

Would that be a run in your stocking, lady? Don't let it bother you. That stocking can now become a useful item in the war program, says the War Production Board. The silk or nylon it contains can be worked over to make powder bags for firing big shells at the enemy. Silk bags are more useful than bags of other materials because they automatically clean the inside of the gun when it is fired. Other materials require special cleaning. A collection campaign will soon get under way to pick up all discarded silk and nylon hose that America's women can give up, and they're being asked to save them for the event.

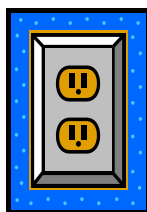



USDA Rural Development has funding available for very low- and low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area.

The Direct Home Loan program offers financing to qualified very-low and low-income applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less.

The maximum loan amount is \$40,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs. Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace.
