Wilmont

Mrs. Caroline Sieve was born in Lohne, Oldenburg, Germany on September 22, 1872, and passed away at 9:30 on the morning of November 2, 1943 at the home of her son, Al, at the age of 71 years. When a young girl of 12 years, Mrs. Sieve came to the United States. On January 30th, 1894 she was married to August Sieve of Arcadia, Iowa. Two years later, in 1896, they moved to Wilmont on the Sieve farm south of town, where they lived until 1915 when Mr. Sieve died. Mrs. Sieve continued to live there until 1936, after which she visited with her sons and daughters here and in California. Into this home nine children were born, all of whom survive their parents. They are located as follows: Henry of Wilmont; Ida (Mrs. Chas. Springman) Wilmont; Frank of Van Nuys, Cal.; Joe of Wilmont, Mary and Emma of Van Nuys, Cal.; Al of Wilmont; Bernard, somewhere in the Pacific, and Paul of Shreveport, Louisiana. Also surviving are a sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Hoelscher of Arcadia, Iowa and two brothers, Henry Kohorst of Arcadia and Clem Kohorst of Corfu, New York. Two years ago Mrs. Sieve submitted to a breast operation at Rochester, Minnesota. Since last winter she has been in failing health, other ailments, also causing her death. Mrs. Sieve was one of the eldest members of Our Lady of Good Counsel parish. During the time she lived here, which was nearly 50 years, she was closely affiliated with the church and was a member of the Altar Society. Mrs. Sieve was a good wife and mother, always worked hard to rear her family along lines of industry, thrift and due regard to their own souls and with respect for the rights of all with whom they came in contact. To her bereaved ones we extend fullest sympathy in the loss they are now facing. Funeral services will be conducted at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church on Saturday morning, Nov. 6th at 10 o'clock, by Rev. John Steger. Burial will be made in the Willmont cemetery, beside her husband.

The fire whistle sounded in our city at about 4:30 Saturday afternoon, when it was learned that the county highway building in the southwest part of town was on fire. Just how the fire started is a mystery, as Nic Broich stated that he had just put the machine in the shed, when flames shot through the building. Mr. Broich was gong to take the machine out of the shed, but found that it was impossible, as the flames had spread all over the machine. It was lucky that he got out of the building without being burned himself. The whole building was on fire when the department arrived, but it didn't take very long before the blaze was under control. It was lucky that a cistern was close at hand where water could be gotten. The building, built in 1939, was not completely burned to the ground, but badly damaged. The grader, which was in the shed at the time of the fire, was badly damaged before it was pulled out by means of a tractor and two trucks. The 1933 model truck was also taken out of the shed, but was not damaged so badly. The grade, operated by Nic Broich, patrolled about 65 miles of road surrounding the Wilmont territory, and the motor truck, driven by Virgil Viessman, covered about 125 additional miles. Mr. Broich and Mr. Viessman want to take this means of thanking the Wilmont Fire Department and anyone who assisted in helping get the fire under control at the county highway building.

Mary Lou Foley Mulligan is a delightful woman I met during the pandemic; we were both taking ZOOM studies through Catholic Charities. During the course of one conversation at the conclusion of one of the studies I found out she grew up in Wilmont and played girls softball. I had to know more. Here is her story.

Mary Lou was born in Tracy to parents Frank and Sadie DeJaeger Foley. Dr. Valentine delivered her and she recalls years later when she graduated from high school in Wilmont at Our Lady of Good Counsel he offered to pay her tuition to college. "I thought he must have been rich, but I said, 'No'."

Dr. Valentine was a well-loved doctor in Tracy, he had delivered Mary Lou and her Dad, Frank; he would go on to deliver all of Mary Lou's siblings. She would become the oldest of nine children, Mary Lou, Patty, Dennis, Leona Jean, Alfred (Freddy), Elizabeth Ann, Alan, Madonna, Kathleen, one of her siblings is deceased.

Mary Lou's dad had his right leg amputated when he was 14, gangrene had set in after an accident. "Dad worked construction," Mary Lou recalled. "The crew he worked with was from Tracy."







19-year-old Worthington man facing multiple felony charges after fatal July crash near St. Kilian

A Worthington teen is facing four felony charges following the July crash that resulted in the death of another Worthington teen and injuries to six others.

Sylius Andrew Kamm, 19, faces a charge of second-degree manslaughter, as well as a charge of criminal vehicular homicide and two charges of criminal vehicular operation.

Law enforcement and emergency personnel were dispatched at approximately 8:10 a.m. July 6 for a motor vehicle crash at the intersection of Nobles County 15 and Nobles County 18 near St. Kilian. Involved were a 1995 Chevy pickup, which was being operated by Kamm, and a 2005 Chevy Silverado crew cab pulling a flatbed trailer hauling construction equipment.

There were multiple injuries at the scene and, of the five adult males in the Silverado, four were taken to local hospitals. The fifth, Eric Fuentes, died at the scene from what a medical examiner called multiple blunt force injuries.

The mother of passengers of the pickup driven by Kamm told law enforcement that the app Life360 showed Kamm was driving at an approximate speed of 81 mph at the time of the crash. One of the passengers in the pickup driven by Kamm sustained lifethreatening injuries and remains hospitalized after coming out of a coma earlier this month.

Kamm was arrested Aug. 4 at his parents' Worthington home. He's lodged in the Nobles County Jail and is scheduled to make his initial appearance before Judge Sherry Haley at 3:45 p.m. Aug. 18 in Nobles County District Court.
