Years Ago—By Audrey Brake Thanks for the many memories!

Taken from Nov. 11, 1943 Wilmont Tribune

Wilmont

The following letter (in part) was received by William Fritz from his son, Robert, who is at Camp Howze, Texas. Oct. 28, 1943 Dear Dad, I just received your letter so I will answer it right away. You wanted a description of what i went through, so here goes. First of all when we left Texas we were supposed to go to Cuba. Well, we did. When we got there we guarded prisoners for three days. On the fourth morning about 3 o'clock they called us all out. The plane was fully loaded with five hundred pound bombs and a full load of T.N.T. There are five belts of combat or tracer ammunition in the tail and in each turret. We took off at 6:15 o'clock and by 8:20 we met a convoy. That convoy landed on a small island and the rest of us kept on our same course. There were three bombers, "Liberators" and three P 38 Fighter Planes. It was the next night just before dark that we sighted a German patrol plane, but didn't get him. He was too fast for our Bombers. They told us we could get a little "shut eye" but to keep our ear phones on. I knew then where we were going and lost all hope in ever seeing the U.S.A. again until after the war. The first thing I heard in the morning was the battle signal. I was ordered to check my guns, which I did and then gave the ready sign. The next thing I heard was "Enemy Aircraft Above", so I got ready. There were five enemy planes. The first one came right at the tail and open fired before he was in range, I open fired and sawed his right wing off. The next one was a ship that I never knew was in in existence. He was very heavily armed for a fighter. He fired his first gun which was a 37 m.m. and it went from the center of the plane right through to the tail and thats the one that got me. The shrapnel from the shell was slowed down by the time it reached me or it would have gone straight thru. Instead it just cracked a couple of ribs. Fifteen minutes later I shot that one down. The turret gunner got the other one and the other two left when they saw we had too much fire power. The reason why a plane always tries for the tail is because it is the weakest spot on the plane. Then we got the "all clear" again and that's when I found out I was hit. But there wasn't a darn thing to it. We bombed out some little town. Didn't see what i looked like before, but afterward, it was nothing but a mass of fire, smoke, and flying pieces. The tail gunner is the only man that sees the damage done. A few minutes after that one of the gunners shot down another plane and that was the last I saw. The men that were killed were out of my crew. The plane looked like a sieve but it still made the jump. I could set here and write for a week about what was going on, and where I was after that, but it isn't necessary. I thought it would be hard to buy shells this year. Are the birds very thick? Write soon, love, Puss (Robert).

Mr. and Mrs. Clem Schlichte received word from their son, Orville, who is at Camp Howze, Texas that he has been promoted to Sergeant. "Fat" is confined to the hospital there with an infected arm.

Pfc. Arnold Hoffman of Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri arrive at Worthington Sunday and was snow-bound there until Tuesday evening when he was met there by his father, John Hoffman, Jake Fath, and daughter, Beatrice.

The mailman finally arrived here Wednesday afternoon about 2:30 from Lismore. After waiting patiently for it for two days, it was a welcome sight. There was no school Monday or Tuesday. All the news this week will be the snow storm, as everybody stayed put over the weekend. On Saturday it began to rain, which by night turned into snow. By Sunday morning a real blizzard was in progress, which kept

at it until Monday evening. The thermometer showed from 25 to 35 above zero which was certainly appreciated. Roads were all backed with drifts as high as 15 feet in some places. Cars and trucks were stuck and stalled on roads Sunday and had to be left there until the snow plow came. Some cars were completely covered with snow.

Funeral services were held at St. Peter and Paul's Catholic Church at Mankato on Friday, November 5th for Mrs. Casper Becker, Sr., who passed away on Tuesday, November 2nd from a lingering illness at Mankato. The Beckers were residents of Nobles County for 33 years, from 1885 to 1918. Mrs. Becker is survived by her husband, four daughters and two sons, namely: Mrs John Suedbeck, Mankato; John, Benson, Mn; Mrs. Bart Schneider, Eagle Lake, Mn.; Mrs. Pete Schneider, Wilmont, Casper, Adrian; and Elizabeth at home. A son preceded her in death in infancy. Sympathy is extended to the bereaved relatives in their sorrow.



Continued from August 11th edition—Mary Lou Foley Mulligan

The Alaska-Canadian Highway had been talked about and discussed at length for years before it became reality when the United States entered World War II. It would become known as the ALCAN Highway.

On February 6, 1942, the construction of the Alaska Highway was approved by the United States Army and the project received the authorization from the U.S. Congress and Roosevelt to proceed five days later. Canada agreed to allow construction as long as the United States bore the full cost, and that the road and other facilities in Canada be turned over to Canadian authority after the war ended. It proved unimportant for the military because 99 percent of the supplies to Alaska during the war were sent by sea from San Francisco, Seattle, and Prince Rupert. Information gathered from Wikipedia. When it was completed it was about 1,700 miles long. And, rough.

Frank Foley purchased the produce station business in Wilmont in 1944. "It was located in the front of the downstairs in what he called the Stuntebeck building on Main Street and at that time there were two apartments upstairs. We would live in the back of the downstairs," Mary Lou explained.

Her mother didn't travel to Wilmont right away, she stayed in Tracy for the first few months awaiting the birth of their son Dennis. "My sister Patty and I traveled to Wilmont with her in early 1945." They would call Wilmont home until they moved in the summer of 1962 when her parents and siblings who were still at home moved to Heron Lake.

"The Foley Produce Station purchased eggs, cream and chickens from farmers in the area. "The eggs had to be candled and graded," Mary Lou explained. "And, as soon as we could count to 10 Dad had us filling the cardboard egg cases with the cardboard separators in which

famers put the eggs and returned them for grading and then payment."

There were batteries in the rear of the building and a small barn in which the chickens were held until one of several larger companies purchased them. "Sometimes a chicken would get loose and any of us kids, or any kids who happened to be there, would run it down and Dad would pay five cents each. If no one caught it in time it would dive down under the Gerber restaurant, never to be seen again!"

"The eggs were candled. We held each egg in front of a light bulb which was in a canister container and looked for defects and we had to weigh each egg," she explained.

Mary Lou started to help her dad with candling when she was 10. "I loved it and felt very grown up," she said. "I could not lift the cases so Dad or Mother had to be there to help

me." What great memories of growing up!

There was also a theater in Wilmont and Mary Lou and her sister Patty would clean it after a show. "We were quite young," Mary Lou recalls, "Sometimes when we were in the building alone and we would climb up in front and dance and sing instead of working very hard. This happened especially after Betty Grable had been in the Sunday afternoon film!"

The produce station was moved when Mary Lou was in high school, it went across the street to the Jake Fath feed store building and the family moved out of the their home in the produce station to a home north of the railroad tracks.

Mary Lou remembers her first day of school at Our Lady of Good Counsel. "I loved school from the first day! I walked all by myself, I had a little blue dress on that my grandma had made for me." But, when she arrived at the front of the school and looked up it looked so big to her she burst into tears.

"Sister Simeon, she was the principal, saw me and leaned over and said, "What's wrong Mary Lou and took me into school." She never looked back and loved her school days in Wilmont.

The school, like many area Catholic schools, was staffed by Franciscan nuns from the Rochester, Minnesota Mother House. "I just loved the Franciscan Sisters that worked so hard

every year to make sure that we loved school," Mary Lou recalled. "At least that is the feeling that I always had. They were regular people but very nice people.

"We lived in town right down the street from the Post Office. We had a wagon and every year when the first Sisters arrived everyone was so excited to see who had returned and who the new ones were."

The family would wait to hear from the Sisters and then they would receive a call. "They would tell us that the last sisters advised them that we had a wagon and would be happy to pick up books and other mail from the post office. We were glad to be among the first ones to know who had arrived!"

Snow days at the school were important and memorable. "They very seldom closed the school," Mary Lou explained. Her siblings, and anyone living in town could walk, it was the students living in the country that wouldn't be able at attend. "We would get there and because there were so few students able to get to school we were able to do all kinds of fun work!"

What was the 'fun work'? According to Mary Lou cleaning black-boards, straightening book shelves, dusting anything they could find and decorating the rooms. "Most important, it

was way more FUN than school was!" Mary Lou said with a chuckle.

What kind of extracurricular activities were there? The nuns were ahead of Title 1X. "We had girls' softball for the few years that we were in high school," Mary Lou said with delight. "We had three games each spring and each fall. We played at Lismore (St. Anthony), St. Adrian and Currie (Immaculate Heart of Mary)."

Both baseball and softball were popular sports in small towns all around Minnesota, it was before the advent of the television set and making your own fun was a part of life. Most

had a beautiful ball field to play on too. Mary Lou recalls Wilmont's diamond, "We actually had a great baseball diamond with a grand-stand and big beautiful lights!"

"In the summer we usually played all around the southwest corner of our state," MaryLou said. "It was great fun and it was the only sport we had for girls. But boys only had baseball and basketball so they had little more than we did. The school games were all day

games and the summer games were usually evening games 'under the lights'."

"One of my fondest memories of Wilmont was playing baseball with the Wolf kids and the Bell kids behind our home and the hardware store," Mary Lou said recently. Of course that changed when they broke one to many windows and moved play time to the ballpark. "My Dad started a girls softball team when I was about 12 or 13 and we played every summer after that."

When the family moved to Heron Lake, one disadvantage was there wasn't girls softball.

"My younger sisters did not have that good fortune."


