

Tidbit

If your horse dies, the loss may be felt more severely by our enemies, according to a farm bulletin issued by the U. of Kentucky. In reducing the value of dead animals to terms of waste fat for glycerine, farmers were told a dead horse would supply enough fat to make glycerine for 75 anti-aircraft shells; a dead sheep, 15 shells, a 100-pound pig, 50 shells; a cow, 80 shells; a calf, 5 shells. The photo this week is from the 1949 "50 Year" celebration of Wilmont. The riders on this float are the 1949 Queen of Wilmont, Kathleen Balster, and her court. Luella Voss, one of the participants, helped identify those in the court. From L-R are Luella Voss, Esther Probst, Kathleen Hendel, Elvira Heinrichs, Marie Middendorf, & LaVonne Heinrichs. A Queen contest ran from Wednesday to Saturday, the week before the event. The rules stated the young ladies had to be between the ages of 16 and 21. Voters could pick their candidate and write her name on a sheet of paper, accompanied with ten cents and place it in an envelope and seal it. Almost every business had a place you could put your envelope with a dime in it. The Queen who was elected would reign over the two-day celebration. The contest closed on Saturday night at 11 o'clock. One detail Luella mentioned was that a person could vote more than once, and some people voted many times. After the 910 votes, cast for 19 different young ladies, were counted, Kathleen Balster received the most votes and elected as Queen of Wilmont. The next top six vote-getters were her attendants.








A traumatic experience Mary Lou recalls from her grade school days in Wilmont was receiving a "C" in physical education. Sitting at a table talking to me, she had a stricken look on her face as she told the tale. "I had no idea what a "C" meant, I had never gotten one and I cried." She clearly remembers her report card was on a sheet of aqua paper. It must have made quite an impression! Her parents couldn't figure why she had a "C" and to this day that "C" is a big question mark in her life. "I would like to know why I received it!" she laughed.

Remember when she said Dr. Valentine offered her tuition money for college? Mary Lou was and is a very bright woman, self-educated. She recalled Father Sullivan, the priest when she

was in high school during a marriage class the students were required to take. "I remember him saying the females should have enough clothes to last awhile! I don't recall him ever telling the boys what they should prepare for!"

"I met Bill (William Mulligan) in the summer of 1961. He had spent two years at Marquette University, a Jesuit school in Milwaukee. Bill worked on the new interstate highway system in the Sioux Falls area to secure the money to return to college. We married at Heron Lakes beautiful Sacred Heart Church on June 20, 1964."

Mary Lou would continue to work for Northwestern Bell, where she first worked after high school graduation. They would transfer her to Olivia, then to Windom. "When we married they let me transfer to Minneapolis.," she explained. She would work full time until 1967 when daughter Karen was born.

"Patrick had arrived in Oct. of 1965. I continued to work part time for several years and finally quit after my fifth child arrived. By that time Bill worked for INA Insurance Company and they transferred us and our seven children to Atlanta, Birmingham, Tampa, Syracuse and finally Boston. Bill retired in 2000 and we moved back to Luverne".

Mary Lou recalls receiving an invite to a high school class reunion; she had graduated in 1959 from Our Lady of Good Counsel. By this time she and her husband and five of their soon to be six children and were living in Minneapolis where Bill would finish school. "It was a 17 year reunion!" she laughed. Seventeen years! And, she received a message, "Bring your glove!"

"I thought, my glove? I won't be able to make it around any bases. The baby was only six weeks old!" She laughs with delight, a spontaneous burst of joy that seems to be a part of

this woman. She brought her glove though, and her family. "The kids thought I was a hero! Idon't think I could even bend over!" What Mom doesn't want to be a hero in the eyes of her

children? The Mulligan children are Patrick, Karen, Maureen, Ellen, Sheila, Laura and Colleen.

They are now scattered around the country and I would image they still consider their Mom a hero.
