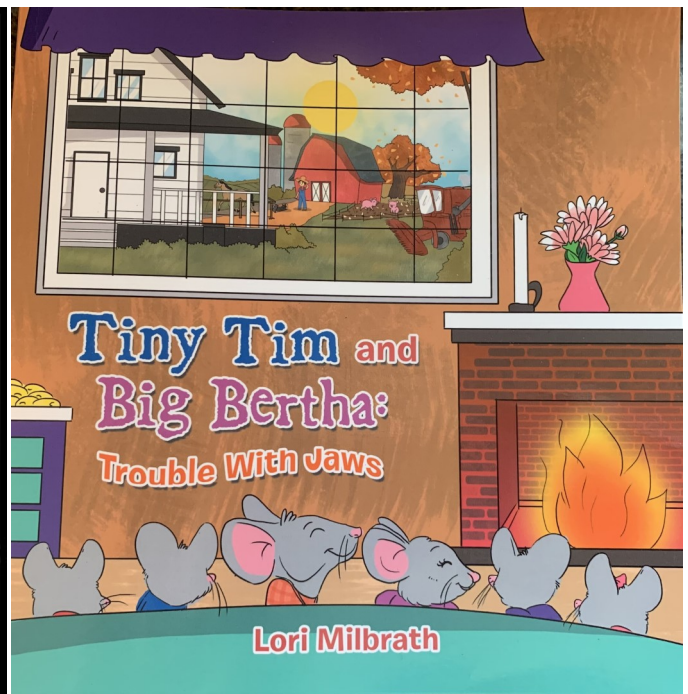

Melvin Driessen was among the bunch that left Monday to be inducted into the services.

Larry Sieve, who has been stationed in Alaska, is spending his furlough with his mother and other relatives.

2n Lt. Richard Lebens arrived here Monday from Chambers, Mass. and spent until Thursday at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Lebens.

Wilmont had one of the quietest elections take place in our village for some time on Tuesday when only 37 votes were cast. Mayor N. D. Bertrand was re-elected by one vote over Joe Probst. In the race for councilman, Art Wulf received more votes than Fred Alberts and will remain as councilman for another three years.

Oscar G. Grant, son of Aaron and Emily Grant, was born December 1, 1886 in Sweden. In 1903, at the age of 17, he came to the United States, going directly to Wilmont to the home of his uncle, Gust Grant, for whom he worked until July 22, 1918. Then he entered the service of his country in World War No. 1. He went across August 31, 1918 and returned to the United States again after the war in 1919, coming back again to the home of Gust Grant in August of that year. He continued to work here until 1924, at which time he entered the employ of the Nobles County Highway Department as patrolman, which job he continued to hold until his death. He passed away December 1 on his 57th birthday at a hunting lodge at Mixpah, Minnesota where he had gone for deer hunting. Apparently recovering from an attack of pneumonia, which he had contracted while hunting, he died very suddenly on Wednesday morning. He leaves to mourn his passing, two sisters, Mrs. A. K. Grant of Worthington, and Mrs. G. A. Shelguist of Wilmont, together with their families, and three cousins, Harry, Arthur, and Ernest Grant of Wilmont, besides many friends. Dependent and efficient, he will be greatly missed by the Highway Department, which he served faithfully for 19 years. Funeral services were conducted here Sunday afternoon at the Presbyterian Church with Rev. James Young in charge. Burial was made in the Wilmont cemetery with full Masonic and Legion honors.

Letter from Wilfred Loosbrock Camp Adair, Oregon Nov. 29, 1943 Dear Pete (Tribune editor), First of all I want to apologize for not thanking you and the Veterans for the Tribune before this as I certainly do appreciate it. I am quite busy and when the day is done, the order fall out is given, I sometimes wonder if they do not mean, "fall down." Our training, it seems, consists mostly of March! March! March! the boys are marching, and someone told me this is a mechanized war. Yes, Sir, Pete, a fella can look back on the last few miles of the hike with pride because of doing such wonderful work camouflaging his tracks. Most of the hikes now are done in double time, — including the breaks, ha. To see a soldier doing double time on the double you have to see him when the words, "mail call" fill the air. Everything is dropped, there is a mad dash for the door as the sick, lame, and lazy suddenly become well. The mail man turns his face to the wall, wondering how we can all stop in time. After mail call, those who got mail walk away with a grin from ear to ear. The rest stand there with that murderous look in their eyes as they say, What, no mail for me? The mailman says he doesn't know if he should say no or run. The power of those words, "mail call" also proved to be quite useful to the Sarge when he wanted men for detail work, that is, at first it did. One night on which I was expecting a letter, the mail call rang thru the room. I led that convoy out of the barracks, but instead of getting what I expected, we came to a halt in front of the Sarge who was grinning as he said, those husky men in front here with all the steam are just the guys I need to haul some garbage tonight, and so that is the way a rookie becomes a soldier. He learns fast. What I was trying to write can be said in a few words, "there is nothing like mail from home". I am classified as a heavy truck driver. At first I thought my pack was the heavy, myself the truck, and the Sarge my driver. I did get to see a lot of the country around here though, and it is really beautiful. We went thru the Cascade Mountains on one trip to and from Bend, Oregon where we picked up some trucks. Was also out to the coast a couple times. Our driving training is for driving where there are no roads. Instead of looking for good places to go thru, the officers look for bad ones, and the worse they are the more they say, "look there is a hell of a good place." This is done all at night without lights as that is when it would be done in combat. It sure is tough and a lot of confusion but its good training for if we ever have to do it over there. Well, Pete, this isn't much of a letter but I wanted to thank you for the paper and let you know I get it every week. As ever, Wilfred

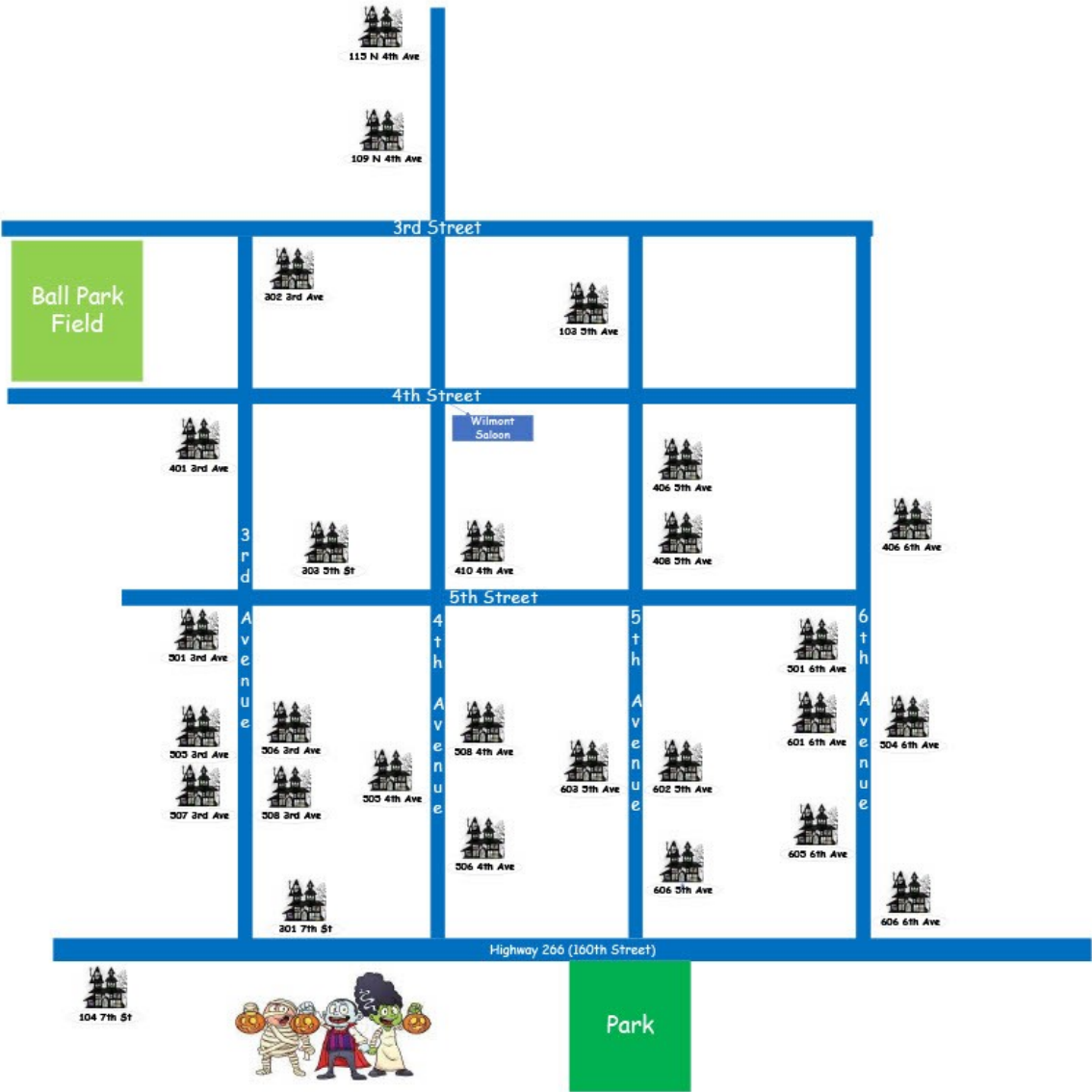

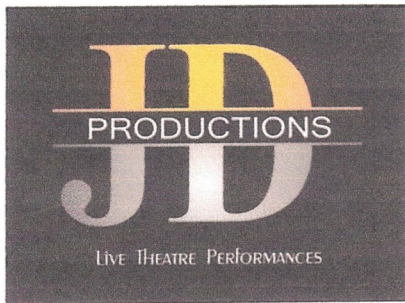

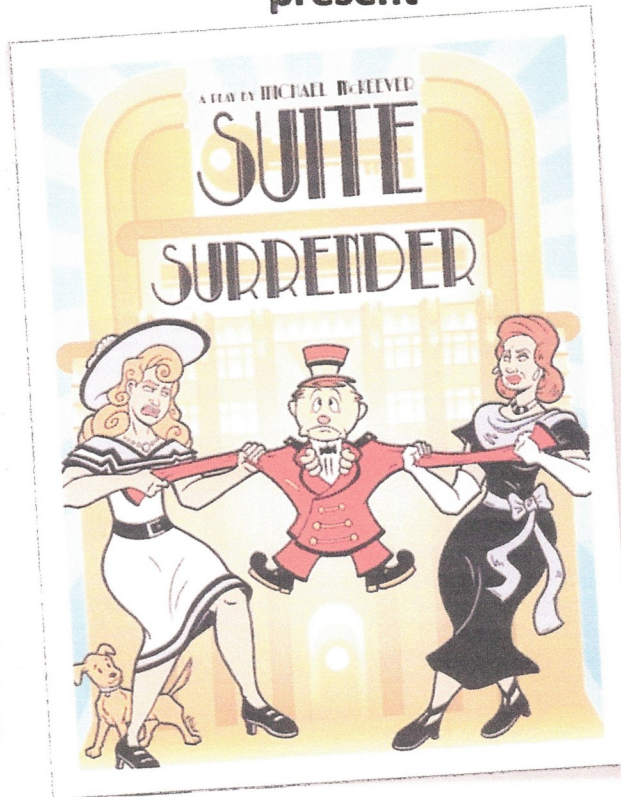
