Letter from somewhere in the South Pacific, Jan. 29, 1944 Dear Pete: For the past five or six months I have been moving around from here to there and my mail has failed to catch up with me, so I am sending you my new address which I hope will be more or less permanent. I always enjoyed getting your paper while back there and it will be more than a treat to get it over here. Hope everyone back there is OK, give 'em by regards and in the meantime I'll be looking forward to getting your paper somewhere down here in the South Pacific. Matt Doran

Dear Editor: I wish to again express my thanks to you and the VFW for sending us boys your paper. As I have moved into Pilot School I would like to have you change my address so I will get the paper regular. That is all I have been doing since I came here is move from one squadron to another. They eliminated so many men that we never could keep a full squadron, so we would move into another. Now that I am in Pilot School I'll stay here approximately 6 to 9 weeks. What I'm getting now consists of classes from morning till night, including Physical Training, Drill, plus strict orders, orders that when given are carried out in the least amount of time possible, and no griping either. They are plenty rough on us and if we can't take it, back to the G. I. Army you go. I'll be glad when I get to Primary school where I'll get all the flying I want, and start moving on to my wings. I have 36 weeks of training to go through before I get my commission and wings. Twenty seven of those will be continuous flying till I learn to fly that P.-51 or B.-12. It's a tough life all the way through and I like it fine. Before coming here I received 3 months of college training at Texas Tech. and had ten hours of dual control flying in L-2A Taylorcraft Cubs. From there I was sent here for classification. I never took so many mental aptitude and physical tests. For hours at a time we were taking tests on paper and running all kinds of machinery to test you aptitude for either Pilot, Bombardier or Navigator. On the thirteenth day we were classified and I got what I wanted, Pilot. I'm very happy about it because it's something I've always wanted. My only hope is that I finish my training alright and get a chance over there to fight Japs and Germans up in the sky. Thank you you again for the paper. Vincent W. Bruns



#### **Photo From the Past**

With the opening of pheasant season last weekend in Minnesota, the photo in this issue is probably from sometime in the1930's. All the birds were hung on the back side of the summer kitchen on the Brake farm. In the photo are Alphonse Brake, ?, Joe Brake. Some facts on the ringneck pheasant, taken from a 48-page booklet written in 1986 called 'Pheasant in Minnesota' follow. The ringneck first came to Minnesota in 1905, when the Department of Game and Fish acquired 70 pairs from Wisconsin and Illinois. None survived. In 1916, the Minnesota Game Protective League established a game farm on Big Island in Lake Minnetonka. The Game and Fish Dept. took over the population in 1917 when the state legislature appropriated \$17,000 for propagating pheasants, bobwhite quail, and ruffed grouse at the game farm. From 1916-1918 4,000 pheasants were released, while they also provided 6,000 eggs to farmers and sportsmen interested in rearing pheasants. by 1922 pheasants had been released in 78 of the state's 87 counties. Minnesota held its first hunt in 1924, but only 300 roosters were taken during a 4-day hunt in Hennepin and Carver counties. The state's record harvest came in 1941, when an estimated 1,790,000 pheasants were bagged in just 17 days. Hunters were allowed one hen in their daily bag of three birds. Changing agricultural and land use practices led to their population decline after 1960.

Willis Buell Adolph, age 88, was born on October 8, 1934, on the family farm north of Worthington, MN, the son of Buell and Ethelyn (Strom) Adolph. He attended Elk Center country school and graduated from Worthington High School. Willis married Marvella Johnson on January 23, 1956, in Reading, MN. He worked for the Minnesota State Highway Department. Willis served in the United States Army from 1957 – 1959. After returning from the military, Willis and Marvella farmed in the Worthington area from 1959 until their retirement. He served as an Elk Township Supervisor for 27 years, was on the Reading Community Center Board and was a USDA Inspector at Campbell Soup Company. In 2003, they moved to Worthington where Willis volunteered locally in the Worthington community. Together they were active members of Bethel Presbyterian Church in Reading, MN, serving as trustee, elder, Sunday school teacher, youth group leader, served on other various committees, and active with the Gideons, sharing God's word. They relied on Christ's guidance throughout their lives. Willis' passion was farming and taking care of the animals on the family farm. He also enjoyed helping Marvella in their many gardens; he also had a small group of fruit trees, especially apples that he made apple cider from. Willis enjoyed sharing his knowledge with others at the fair where he was the Horticulture Supervisor for many years. In January of 2022, Willis entered Maple Lawn Nursing Home in Fulda and was loved and well cared for during his time there. Willis went to his eternal home on his birthday of 88 years on October 8, 2022.

Willis is survived by his wife, Marvella of Worthington, MN; son, Kevin (Sherrie) Adolph of Rushmore, MN; two grandchildren, Anthony (Heidi) Adolph of Horace, ND and Samantha Scholten of Brandon, SD; five great grandchildren, Montana, Isabel, Bentley, Abel, and Beau; sister, Carol Hanna; sister-in-law, Janet Adolph, and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents; son, Kim Alan Adolph; brothers, Lyle & Myrtle Adolph, Alfred & Dorothy Adolph, and Myron Adolph, and brother-in-law, Terry Hanna.

Funeral services were held at the Bethel Presbyterian Church in Reading, MN.
