

Mr. and Mrs. H. L. Slater have just received a letter from their son, Ray, who is in the Navy and has been stationed on an air craft carrier on the east coast for the past several months, informing them that he has been transferred to the west coast. He says they had a very enjoyable trip on the transfer. The trip was made on their carrier (censored) by the way of Cuba, Haiti, Jamaica and Bahama Islands thru the Panama Canal and up to San Diego. He reports the trip thru the canal on a carrier is really a trip worth while and not soon to be forgotten. They could touch the branches of trees on either side more than once. The trip required twelve ours to go thru the canal. They also had several house shore leave at Panama City, and reports they didn't think there was a tire, banana, or nylon hosiery shortage in the U.S. the way windows are stocked down there. Ray says he thinks he will enjoy the climate in the Pacific better than on the Atlantic where they encounter one store after another. At Panama City it was really warm, fifteen minutes on the deck without a shirt would really start a tan. So far they haven't encountered any Japanese yet.

She had been ill a week with virus flu. Burial was made in the Wilmont cemetery. Mrs. Spartz was born at Clark, S. Dak., on June 3rd, 1912. On Mary 10, 1941 she was married to Joe Spartz at Slayton. She is survived by her husband, six children, Catherine, John and Mary (by a former marriage), and Peter, Theresa and Veronica. Also surviving are her mother, Mrs. J. A. Smith, Clark, S. Dak., one brother, J. W. Smith of Sioux City, Iowa, five sisters, Mrs. J. Fabey, Hot Springs, S. Dak., Mrs. J. E. Kennealley, Marcella, Lucile, and Constance Smith of Clark, S. Dak.

Funeral services were held Friday afternoon, March 10th at the Presbyterian Church for Mrs. Chester Miller, with the Rev. James Young officiating. Burial was made in the Wilmont cemetery.
