Slater have just received a letter from their son, Ray, who is in the Navy and has been stationed on an air craft carrier on the east coast for the past several months, informing them that he has been transferred to the west coast. He says they had a very enjoyable trip on the transfer. The trip was made on their carrier (censored) by the way of Cuba, Haiti, Jamaica and Bahama Islands thru the Panama Canal and up to San Diego. He reports the trip thru the canal on a carrier is really a trip worth while and not soon to be forgotten. They could touch the branches of trees on either side more than once.
