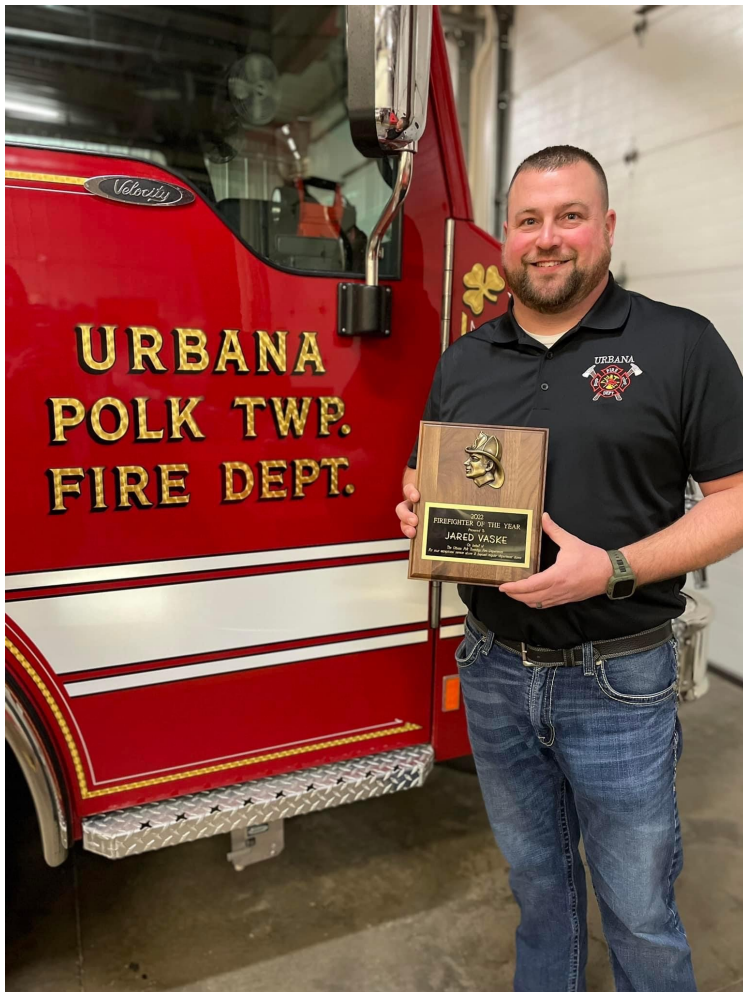

Wilmont

Pvt. Vogt Killed in Anzio, Italy - Receipt of a war message that their son, Pvt. Raphael L. Vogt had been killed in action in Italy, was disclosed by Mr. and Mrs. Dan Vogt yesterday. Pvt. Vogt entered the Army April 18, 1942 at the age of 22 and never was home on a furlough. After training at Camp Roberts and Fort Ord, Calif., and Camp Pickett, Va., he departed overseas on October 23rd. Driver of a jeep, he went thru the north African and Sicilian Campaigns unscathed, and then to Italy, where he took part in the Anzio beachhead stalemate. It was while he was so engaged that he was killed on March 25. Two other brothers, Clifford, 27, and Vernon, 21, have registered in this county under the Selective Service Act. The older was classified 4-F, while the younger is at home on a farm deferment classification. (Raphael Vogt was a brother to Mrs. Ed (Phylis) Schettler. He was also a member of the Wilmont VFW.)

She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Schettler of Wilmont. Sgt. Schettler is on duty as a weather observer at the Base Weather Station, Waco Army Air Field, Texas. She is a graduate of Mankato State Teacher's College and was a teacher prior to entering the service on October 18, 1942.

Special meeting was called to order by the President of the Council, N. D. Bertrand with all members present. Mrs. Rielly, Henry Almann and Joe Probst appeared before the council by the request of the village council to discuss the closing hours for the beer places. A motion was made and seconded that the closing hours on week days be 12 o'clock p.m. and on Saturday's and dance nights, 1 o'clock a.m. sharp. No beer after 12 o'clock p.m. on weekdays. Beer places are to close at eleven o'clock p.m. on Sunday evenings. No beer on Sunday mornings in the village of Wilmont, Minn. Motion carried. Motion was made and seconded that all kids under the age of 18 years of age are not allowed to play pool unless they have written permission from their parents and consent of the pool hall proprietor. Motion carried. There being no further business, a motion was made to adjourn. P. J. Wagner, village clerk.

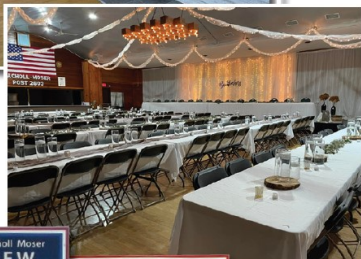

She is preceded in death by her parents, husband, Bob, infant daughter, Dorothy, two grandsons, Jason Woodcock, and Derick Sour, and one daughter-in-law, Deb Jenkins.

Funeral services were held at IHM Church in Currie. Interment was at Calvary Cemetery in Currie.

Senate Minority Leader Mark Johnson (R-East Grand Forks) released the following statement on the passage of House File 1 from the Senate early Tuesday morning:

“Today we are not codifying Roe v. Wade or Doe v. Gomez, we are enacting the most extreme bill in the country regarding youth sterilization, late-term abortions, and public liability for a vast array of reproductive services. All this with just a one-seat majority. A casual observer would think Minnesota voters gave democrats a significant majority and mandate to ram through radical and extreme legislation that will fundamentally change the lives of everyday Minnesotans.

“Today Minnesota Senate Republicans demonstrated, through a series of good faith amendments, the significant and devastating shortcomings of this bill. I’m very disappointed our amendments to restrict late-term, saline, and dismemberment abortions, protect minors from dangerous abusers, and defend the lives of babies with Down syndrome were all rejected by every Democrat in the Senate. It really is the most extreme abortion bill, not just in the state, but in the world.”

The bill was passed on party lines, 34-33. Senate Republicans offered a number of critical amendments—all of which were struck down on party-line votes, and many of which were not deemed worthy of discussion by the majority party. Key amendments that were offered include:

Ban on third trimester abortions, Prohibition of the violent Dilation and Evacuation (D&E) abortions, Language that would have excluded sterilization from the umbrella of “reproductive rights”, Requirement of parental notification, Language that would have prevented the sterilization of minors, Prohibition of abortions due to down syndrome

Senator Weber, Senate approve \$100 million in tax relief for individuals and small businesses

Last Wednesday, Jan. 11, the Senate passed a tax conformity bill, bringing Minnesota in line with recent federal tax changes and cutting tax collections by more than \$100 million, said Senator Bill Weber (R-Luverne). The tax relief bill was passed with bipartisan support and signed into law by the governor on Thursday, Jan. 12.

“The tax conformity legislation is a perfect example of a bipartisan accomplishment that will improve the lives of Minnesotans,” said Senator Weber. **“However, this should not be the only tax relief we pass this session. While our state has a historic surplus of \$17.6 billion, Minnesota families’ budgets are facing great uncertainty. It is imperative to take larger steps to lessen their financial burden and provide meaningful, permanent tax relief.”**

The bill aligns the Minnesota tax code with Federal tax changes that resulted in many tax changes, including: The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act from 2020, The American Rescue Plan (ARPA) Act from 2021, and The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) from 2022.

Notable provisions in the bill:

- Expand eligible expenses to college savings accounts through Section 529 plans
- Exclude shuttered venue operator grants from being counted as income
- Allows for student loan payments by employers
- Increases the amount a business can provide for employee child care benefits

Missing from the bill is the elimination of the tax on Social Security or any reduction in personal tax rates. Senate Republicans tried to amend these changes to the bill, but Democrats opposed the move through parliamentary procedure.
