



This photo is of Dr. and Mrs. W. W. Brown, who was Wilmont's physician from 1947 until his death in 1957. He first practiced in the former home of Dr. Waller, which was the house located just south of the Champlin Gas station. He left Wilmont for two years in 1950 & 1951 and then returned and eventually moved his practice to big square home formerly lived in by Paul Sieve's, Marie Vortherms, and Wade Johnson's. After Dr. Brown's passing, Wilmont no longer had a town doctor. This picture was taken in the former Bree-z-Inn at a party in honor of Dr. & Mrs. Brown. Notice the small window above Mrs. Brown's head. That is where waitresses in the cafe put their food order in to whoever was running the kitchen. The dark opening on the right side led to the bowling allies.


