On Tuesday, July 26th, 1932, on a house boat on the banks of the Mississippi River, my grandma Marion was born. She was an only child, born to parents Ruth and Otis. She spent much of her childhood raised by her grandmother.

She met my grandpa Glenn at a roller skating rink, where he asked her to write to him while he was deployed in Korea (1950-1952). She did. He earned the Purple Heart and Silver Star Medals of Honor, and then came home and asked her to marry him. They wed on May 9th, 1953. They loved the VFW, traveling, camping, their children, their country, and their God. On October 11th, 2013, my grandpa died. My grandma missed him dearly every day since. Their love was beautiful; I always hoped to emulate them.

On May 29th, 2023, there was one hell of a reunion in heaven.

Marion was a generous and loving woman. She used to tell everyone that she didn't want any flowers at her funeral, [but while she was alive to actually enjoy them]. In lieu of flowers, she wanted money to be donated to the scholarship fund that my grandpa and her created to help send kids to college. She always wanted a higher education, but could never afford it. As a girl, her dream was to be a nurse, and so she was always so excited that I was an able to become a doctor. She used to tell me she would wait to die until after I graduated from medical school, and then from residency. She was 25 days short of her goal, but now she has the best seat in the house.

She absolutely loved her "kids" at the school she volunteered at until COVID and her health forced her to stop going in 2020. She was also an avid volunteer at the VFW. Devotion to others was paramount in her life.

We had many lovely memories together. We often enjoyed a beer and a burger at River Ratz in Buffalo City, where she lived. Those are some of my favorite memories. She loved those Jeep rides!

Her only bad quality was the fact that she was a Packers fan. I guess no one can be perfect!

My grandma used to always say a variant of, "You have to do the things you want to do today, because you never know if you'll wake up tomorrow." She believed that, and she lived that. She was content with leaving this earth knowing she had really, truly lived.

Thank you so much to everyone who sent her cards throughout the years. That meant the world to her - and to me. It was a privilege to know her and to love her.

I'll see you again, and until then, I'll see you in the stars.



Mr. and Mrs. Nic Broich received a telegram Friday afternoon which left them grief-stricken and saddened the entire community. It was from the Adjutant General and was as follows: Washington, D.C., 1:00 p.m.. August 18 To: Nicholas Broich, Box 44, Wilmont, Minnesota The Secretary of War desires me to express his deep regret that you son, Private First Class Cletus F. Broich, was killed in action on the twenty-ninth of July in France. Ulio, The Adjutant General. Cletus was shipped overseas in June. A Requiem High Mass will be held at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church on Wednesday morning, August 30th at 8:30. A complete writeup will be given next week, as the Broich family is in hopes that a letter will arrive giving them more information.

A Requiem High Mass was held on Wednesday morning, August 30th at 8:30 at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church for Pfc. Cletus Broich, 25, son of Mr. and Mrs. Nic Broich, who was killed in action in France, July 29th. Services were conducted by Rev. John Steger and the sermon was given by Rev. Henry Tennessen of St. Kilian. Honorary pallbearers were: Paul Probst, Henry Slater, W. J. Sievers, Julius Middendorf, J. J. Carey and John Brake. The Veterans of Foreign Wars, Pacholl-Moser Post No. 2603 presented Mrs. Broich with a United States Flag. Cletus Broich was born December 6th, 1918. He is survived by four sister and two brothers, Mrs. Lyle Hull (Margaret Catherine), Los Angeles; Mrs. John Perry (Mary Josephine), Los Angeles; Mrs. Frances Pieper (Noreen), Williams, Minn.; Elinor at home; and Leonard J. and Jerome J. Broich, Rochester, Minn. Two of the brothers-in-law are serving with the armed forces in the South Pacific. Broich was inducted March 5, 1942. He went overseas in June of this year, just after the invasion of France. He received his training and was in the Coast Guard unit just before he was killed, when he was assigned to the infantry in preparation for the drive. Cletus was home on furlough February 21st, 1944. He left here March 6th for Rochester to visit with his brothers before he left for his camp, March 8th. Heartfelt sympathy is extended to the Broich family by their many friends here.

One hundred WACS and 250 American soldiers, stationed at a field headquarters for Services of Supply in England have been awarded the Good Conduct Medal. The red and white service ribbon, worn in place of the medal which will be cast after the war, is awarded for exemplary behavior, efficiency and fidelity over a period of time. WACS receiving the service ribbon include: Private First Class Margaret C. Stuntebeck, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Stuntebeck of Wilmont.




