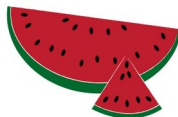


Notice Wilmont Township Land Owners and Operators

The Wilmont Township Board is publishing this notice to inform all land owners and operators of farmland in Wilmont Township according to **Minnesota State Township law 160-27 subdivision 5 article 2**, to inform you that it is unlawful, to till any road right-of-way, being 33 feet from the center of the road, except for the establishment of permanent vegetative cover. If you are in doubt as to where the Township right-of-way is along your or other rented property you farm, please contact a member of the Township Board. Farming of the right-of-way is a misdemeanor and the township has the right to destroy the crop.

Also all ditches must be kept free of rocks, junk, trash or other debris. Spray noxious weeds, cut trees and brush, mow after August 1st and before October 1st.

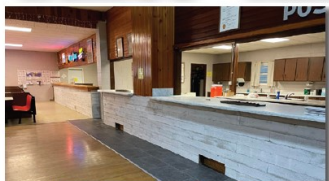

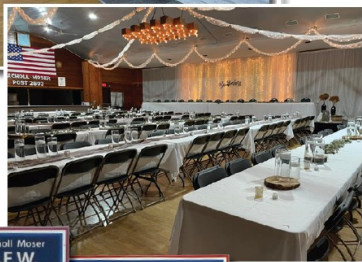
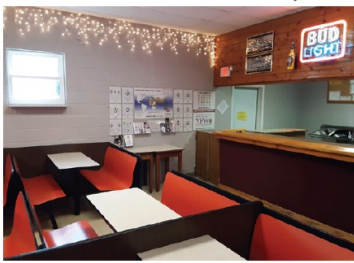
