Plus we need volunteers to come to Worthington to pick up the meals and deliver to the hours or come to your Senior Center for a get together.

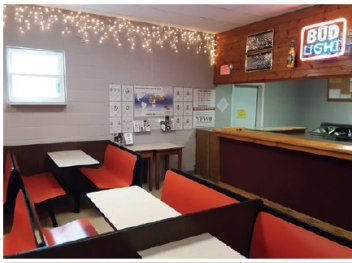

Notice Wilmont Township Land Owners and Operators

The Wilmont Township Board is publishing this notice to inform all land owners and operators of farmland in Wilmont Township according to **Minnesota State Township law 160-27 subdivision 5 article 2**, to inform you that it is unlawful, to till any road right-of-way, being 33 feet from the center of the road, except for the establishment of permanent vegetative cover. If you are in doubt as to where the Township right-of-way is along your or other rented property you farm, please contact a member of the Township Board. Farming of the right-of-way is a misdemeanor and the township has the right to destroy the crop.

Also all ditches must be kept free of rocks, junk, trash or other debris. Spray noxious weeds, cut trees and brush, mow after August 1st and before October 1st.

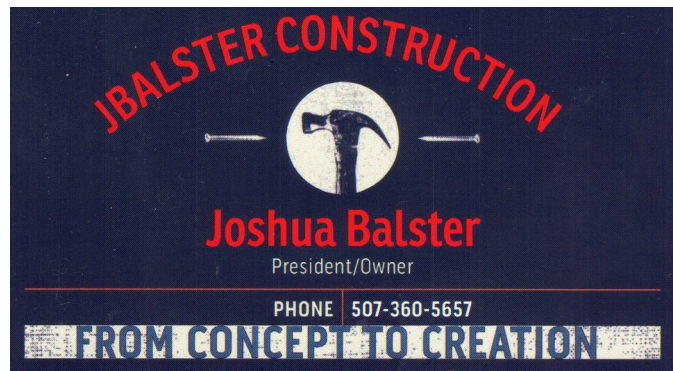
She is preceded in death by her parents, siblings, Bob, Joanne, Janet, Peter, and Margaret.



Somewhere in the Pacific: Dear Pete, I got to thinking about the old days and Wilmont and because your welcome paper has again lost track of me. I thought I'd better send you my present address if I want to get a few copies of it. Moving around sort of mixes up the mail situation, especially over here. I have made several changes since the last address I gave you. Your paper is greatly appreciated. It gives me an idea of what goes on around there. I understand there are a number of fellows around New Guinea from back there, but I never had the pleasure of meeting up with any of them. This old tropical life isn't the best in the world, and I'll be mighty glad when I can try my luck fishing back in a good old Minnesota lake again. My regards to everyone and thanks to you and the V.F.W. for the paper. Good luck - Matt Doran

Teresa Marie Schettler, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Schettler of Wilmont, recently completed an orientation course designed to bridge the gap between training in the States and actual work in this war theater of operations. At this Air Service Command Station, Sgt. Schettler attended a series of lectures given by veterans of this command which included instructions on chemical warfare defense and pertinent tips on staying healthy in a combat zone. Her next station will be one from which America's fighting planes cover our liberation of Occupied Europe.
