Staff Sgt. Bernard Kuhl left Monday for Trinidad, Colorado after spending his furlough at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Kuhl, and other relatives and friends.

Mr. and Mrs. John Schettler received word that their son, Cpl. Edwin Schettler, has arrived in Belgium and their daughter, Sgt. Theresa Schettler, has arrived in France safely.

Cpl. Albert Lenz returned to Fort Riley, Kansas Sunday after having spend a 14-day furlough with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Lenz.

Pfc. Arnold Hoffman returned to his camp at Fort Leonardwood, Mo. last Tuesday after a week's furlough and attending his sister's wedding.

Cpl. Arthur Midendorff left Wednesday for Sort Snelling after visiting his mother, Mrs. Emma Midendorff the past month. He also visited other relatives and friends here.

Letter to Tribune from Benny Hensen, New Guinea, October 20, 1944 (He was from Worthington and played baseball for Wilmont.) Dear Laura and Pete, Yes, Laura, I know how hard it is for Pete to write but it's the same story for all of us. Before I came into the Army, I didn't care to write, but it's a lot different now. It gets mighty lonesome if a person didn't get mail, especially from home. So, Pete, some time you better break down and write a letter, or I'll take care of you when I get back, ha. Yes, I get your paper, and I might add that it's grand to get that news from home. Naturally the mail service is irregular, so I often get a paper before the previous week's paper gets here. It make no difference . . . just so I get it. From the sound of your letter you must not have received my last letter . . . or did you? In it I told you about meeting B. Kuhl and that I was getting the paper. Bud and I were together about two months back in May and June. He often talked about his brother, Leo, and was hoping to meet up with him. Right at present I owe Bud a letter and I'm due for a bawling out if I don't write soon. When you're in a topographic outfit in the Army it really means work, especially out here where there are so many islands. Never did I think there were so many spots in all my life. Our work has been very heavy and turns out to be a terrible mental strain at times. We operate two shifts and during rush periods, it's 24 hours a day and seven days a week. On the side we print Jap propaganda leaflets which have been very successful with some of those isolated Japs. Yesterday and today the Americans landed in the Phillipines. From the radio reports heard so far, it is quite a large operation. Let's hope it is the beginning of the end for the Japs. The weather here has been a problem. It will rain for two weeks in a row, just as hard as it can come down. Then we will have hot weather for a couple days. By hot weather I mean anything over 120 degrees. We manage to get our share of those days. Regardless of that temperature, we do have our softball games. The action is just a little slower than back home but the spirit is just as strong. Entertainment is so scarce that we will do most anything to get some relief from our work. There's nothing better than a good old ball game. Movies are our best entertainment in New Guinea. We usually see three movies a week if we are not working on a rush job. Last week I attended the premier of "Devotion' starring Ida Lapino, Olivia DeHaviland, Paul Henreid and Arthur Kennedy. It is a dramatic story of an English family about 100 year ago. The picture will be shown in the states in '45. News from here is very scarce so you will have to excuse this short letter. Take good car of yourselves and best of luck with your business. Say 'hello' to Aunt Maggie when you get to see her. Till the next time, so

Reprinted with Permission from Julie Buntjer—Worthington Globe—WILMONT — The sun shone down on John Penning Wednesday morning as he sat on his back patio and looked out over a 14.5-acre soybean field filled with three generations of his family and a generation or two of family friends.

The group — numbering more than 30 — were armed with hoes and willing hands, ready to pull up weeds and hack at volunteer corn that has bothered John all summer. His home, on the outskirts of Wilmont, looks over the field he planted this spring and opted not to spray. At \$10 an acre for chemical, he thought he could save the money and live with the weeds.

It turns out he couldn't.

He pulled some of the weeds closest in view of the family's home. But health issues cropped up earlier this summer — headaches that had him taking Tylenol morning and night, unexplained trouble with his balance, and vision problems that didn't quite bring things into focus. Carolyn, John's wife of 46 years, said on their own, each issue could be explained away. Everybody gets headaches from time to time; and, at 75, John was getting to be about the age where cataracts can fog vision. The balance issue was puzzling, though. John thought perhaps it was his heart acting up again.

A trip to the Avera Heart Hospital in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, last week, however, revealed nothing wrong with his ticker. The Pennings returned home, but John knew something was wrong. He just didn't feel right.

Another trip to the ER, during which John and wife Carolyn explained his symptoms, and the medical staff decided John should have a CT scan. The results, just shared with the Pennings late last week, were that John has two large brain tumors — glioblastomas. They are inoperable, Grade 4 tumors.

After returning home with the diagnosis, John had one request — that the weeds and volunteer corn be removed from that soybean field behind their home. Sons Russ and Brian reached out to family and friends to make it happen.

The plan was to show up at the Penning residence at 9 a.m. Wednesday, but the first eager bean walkers were there by 8. As more people arrived, John asked what was going on. Already, he was confused by the countertop filled with freshly-baked cinnamon rolls — a customary treat baked by Carolyn for various occasions, including feeding the bean walkers they hired decades ago, before chemicals made bean walking a thing of the past.

One by one and family by family, they walked into the garage, shook John's hand or patted him on the shoulder. He'd smile, reference their family ties or how the now-parents used to work for them on the farm, and continue to say he couldn't believe how many people showed up.

"We live in such a wonderful, caring community and it warms your heart to see what someone will do for you at the drop of a hat," said Carolyn.

Keith Spartz was among the bean walkers Wednesday morning. As a kid, one of his summer jobs was walking beans for the Pennings.

"It brings back old memories," he said, quick to add that walking beans was not a favorite summer memory growing up. When he heard the call for volunteers, he was ready to "make a good neighbor happy."

Brian Penning was pleased with the number of people who showed up to help clear a small soybean field. "It just shows how much people respect him; people really like him and wanted to come out and do this for him," he said. "We've had so many people reach out. This was just a quick word of mouth Wilmont thing (Tuesday) and I'm sure if we could have had more notice, we would have had more people here."

The group made quick work of the field though, pulling all of the volunteer corn and weeds in the entire field in about 40 minutes. And, as they worked, John looked out at them with a grin on his face. "It just blew my mind — I couldn't believe it," he said of the people who came to help.

With a lifetime habit of dropping f-bombs and expletives in casual conversation, John said, "I just wanted that s*** out of there."

Then he said, "I've cried a lot the last couple of days — blessings. I'd like to see a lot of years but it ain't going to happen.

"Tomorrow goes on," John said. "Weigh your stuff." He's had a good life, filled with ups and downs like everyone has. He served 19 months in Vietnam, returning home before he reached his 21st birthday. He was exposed to Agent Orange there. "I don't think I'll go very far," he added. "I'm glad to see this (the volunteers walking beans). This is so good in my book."

John has served on the Nobles County Planning Commission and Nobles County Board of Adjustment since 2016. In 2008, he and Carolyn were honored with the county's Farm Family of the Year award. Their farm has hosted Breakfast on the Farm, and been included on the Minnesota State Cattlemen's Tour. Sons Russ and Brian raise cattle on the home farm today.
