

Nicholas Hippert of Galesburg, Illinois arrived home early Tuesday morning and will spend a furlough at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Hippert Sr., and with other relatives and friends. Mr Hipper spent about 33 months overseas and left here nearly three years ago and hasn't been home since.

Sgt. and Mrs. Ray Kremer left Wednesday for Fort Langley Field, Virginia after visiting relatives here and in Iona.

Mr. and Mrs. Tony Baumgardner accompanied Cpl. Arthur Middendorff to Minneapolis Friday morning.

Funeral services were held on Saturday morning, Nov. 25, at 9:30 for William Schissel at Our Lady of Good Counsel by Rev. John H. Steger. Burial was made in St. Anthony's Catholic Cemetery in Lismore. Pallbearers were Peter Spartz, N. D. Bertrand and Alphonse Hendel of Wilmont and F.G. Noonan, F. W. Miller and Louie Altman of Lismore. William Schissel was born on March 1, 1877 in Winneshiek County, Iowa, son of Peter and Theresa Schissel. He received his education in the Parochial school at Ossian, Iowa and remained with his parents until he was 21 years old. He came to Nobles county in 1900 and has lived here since. On November 26, 1905 he was united in marriage to Barbara Cuckoos at St. Kilian, Mn. They made their home at Lismore until 1929 when they moved to Wilmont. To this union 15 children were born. They are: Stella Gaudette of Stuart, Fl., Florence Antony of Worthington, Viola Gerber of St. Paul, Leona O'Donnell of Cal., Geraldine Linn of St. Paul, Delores, Marion, and Joyce at home, Leo Schissel of Lismore, Edward in the Army in the Pacific, Robert at home, Paul in the Army in Italy, David in St. Paul, Kenneth in the Army in France, and Gordon in the Army in Arkansas. Also surviving are two sisters and four brothers. They are Miss Hildegard Schissel of Dubuque, Iowa, Mrs. Marie Offerman of Faribault, Mn., Joseph Schissel of Milwaukee, Hugo and Henry Schissel of Lismore and John Schissel of St. Cloud. Also one grandchild survives. Mr. Schissel suffered a heart attack at his home early Sunday morning and later that day was taken to a Worthington Hospital. He passed away on Wednesday at 2 a.m. at the age of 67 years.

Plans are complete for one of the biggest fox and rabbit hunts ever staged in Wilmont, starting at 1 o'clock p.m. sharp on Sunday, December 10th. St. Kilian and Iona will be here with bells on. Enough men are wanted to cover four sections at one time. Bring a driver for your car. A number from Wilmont attended the hunt at Iona last Sunday. Three foxes and a large number of rabbits were killed. Rules: shotguns only and no boys under 17 years of age allowed.

Twenty-eight voters marched to the polls Tuesday to cast their vote. This is the smallest vote cast for some time in this village. The following candidates were re-elected for another term: Assessor - J. J. Broich, Councilman - George Moser, Treasurer - Bernard

Stuntebeck, Village Clerk - P. J. Wagner

The Wilmont Cagers defeated the Iona High in an exciting and hard fought game at the school gym. The second team defeated Iona by a score of 16 to 9. Vincent Slater was the shining star of that game by getting nine points. Jim Slater and Richard Balster played a good defensive game. The first team of Wilmont came through again victorious by a score of 26 to 16. Dick Kuhl was high point man with nine points, followed by Rodney Olson, who had 7 and Dale Kasper was high point man for Iona with six points. Tonight the boys will meet Ellsworth at the school gym. The first game will start at 7:30 sharp.

The final report of the Nobles County War Service Fund Drive ended with the area towns of Wilmont collecting \$376.50, Lismore collecting \$220.25, and Reading collecting \$111.42. Area township collections included Wilmont - \$285.00, Bloom - \$311.00, Larkin - \$274.58, Summit Lake - \$315.75, and Lismore - \$334.25. The total county collection was \$21,841.02. This is a 110% quota of \$18,000.

Henrietta "Heinie" Lais, 100, of Worthington, MN passed away on Monday, September 11, 2023 at home. Mass of Christian Burial will be at 10:30 AM on Friday, September 15, 2023 at St. Anthony Catholic Church in Lismore. Visitation will be at St. Anthony Catholic Church on Thursday, September 14, 2023 between 5-7 PM. Interment will be at the St. Anthony Catholic Cemetery. Benson Funeral Home is caring for the family.

Heinie Lais, born Henrietta Veronica Krogman in Lismore, MN to Frank and Elizabeth Krogman in 1923, was one of seven children. She graduated from St. Anthony Catholic School. Later she married Leo "Tony" Lais, and moved to Worthington, MN in 1953. She and Tony raised 2 boys, Doug, and Craig. She worked at Ehlers Steakhouse and Andersons Dress Shop in Worthington. In the 1970s, a dream came true with a chance to build their own handicap accessible home.

Heinie was deeply devoted to our Lord and Savior and lived a life of true Christian values and service. She was a volunteer for many activities at St. Mary's church and school. She helped at funerals, sang in the choir, greeted parishioners at the door, provided decorations for the school, hosted bible study in her home. She was a dedicated caregiver for Tony for over 30 years, who suffered from multiple sclerosis and was wheelchair bound in later years. At Christmas, she often invited large numbers of friends of the church and relatives to attend Mass in her home celebrated by one of our priests, followed by a home cooked meal. She had two kitchens in her home and could cook for three days for a crowd of 75 guests.

Heinie loved to volunteer in Worthington and surrounding community. She was in perpetual motion and always willing to pitch in and help others. She helped those terminally ill at Sunset Hospice Cottage. She was a long- time election judge up until her early 90s. She enjoyed her time on the Nobles Art Center Board. This past July, she was honored as a 76- year member of Ct. St. Bernard #886 Catholic Daughters of the Americas at St. Anthony church in Lismore. She was a long- time auxiliary member of Lismore American Legion Post 636. She supported Worthington's sister city Crailsheim, Germany by hosting a foreign exchange student in her home. She was adventurous. She enjoyed distant travel to Hawaii, Germany, Poland, Medugorge, and a special trip to Rome to see Pope John Paul II. Closer to home, she hosted five guys on a bike ride stay at her home.

Heinie had many interests including a talent for crafts and gardening. She designed large wreaths from pinecones and pheasant feathers. She was an interior decorator at heart with a passion for antiques and collecting. One year, the Worthington Globe honored her with best decorated home for Christmas. This Summer 2023, she and her son Craig received the Worthington Globe Flower Power yard of the week award. For a time, she rented retail space in the Worthington Mall to sell her antiques.

Heinie lived a century and was blessed with a rich spiritual life and excellent health. She had a lifetime devotion to our Lord Jesus Christ and his mother, our Blessed Virgin Mary. Last January, she was delighted as many friends and family showered her with more than 50 birthday cards recognizing her 100th birthday. She was cared for in her home by her son Craig. A special thank you to the caring staff at Engage Homecare for providing personal services.

She is survived by her children Craig Lais of Worthington, Doug (Toni) Lais of Sioux Falls; 4 grandchildren, 3 great grandchildren; special niece Gloria Carlberg, and many nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.

She was preceded in death by her husband Leo Lais, her parents, siblings Val Dyslin, LeRoy Krogman, Levi Krogman, Gloria June Dodson, Joyce Myers and Sandra Krogman-Spidel.


