

My grandma Caroline Werner Broich died before I was born, however her younger sister Rose Werner Neppl helped me with genealogy and she had this old photo book, 35 old tin type photos, and she left me make copies, some she knew some she did not. Since mid-1970's I have worked to ID them. Rose knew this one - Uncle George Hoffman she called him. I really appreciate your help and it makes me happy to get this photo to his family. My hubby and I knew Broich family from Wilmont, MN. Helena Spartz she moved farther north in MN and we visited them. Helena connected me back to my Broich family in Germany too. Anton Broich, Chris Broich, Adam Broich as well as LaParal that would be Hoffman connection. The Laparell family came from France with a rather large family settled Lancaster, NY. My great-great-grandfather Lorenz Hoffman married one of their daughters Anna Maria Laparell. A lot of children in that Laparell family and some served Civil War.

My grandparents Ted and Caroline Werner Broich lived there about 1899-early 1900 when they moved back to Carroll Co., IA. My grandpa Ted Broich brother's Adam Broich and Chris Broich remained in Wilmont area. Some of my Werner family also lived for a time there. I have copies of some old family photos that belonged to my great-grandfather Joseph Werner and Mary Hoffman. Mary was the sister of George Hoffman. I have an old photo my great Aunt ID as George Hoffman as a young man and would love to get a copy of it to his family. George Hoffman was born Lancaster, NY and come to lowa first Winneshiek Co, IA and for a time Carroll Co. George Hoffman was my grandma Caroline Werner Broich's uncle.

Santa will come to Wilmont this year, by plane, if weather permits. He will have a bag of candy and goodies for each child that is in Wilmont on that day. Santa has not set a definite hour that he will arrive, but it is generally believed that it will be between 2:30 and 3:00 p.m. He intends to land at the Scholtes Airport north of town and would like to have a nice delegation of kiddies out to welcome him here and escourt him into town to the pavilion where he will pass out the bags of candy. But, just a word of caution, everyone must stay off the runway until after the plane has made a landing, so no one will be injured by the plane. It is believed that this is the first daytime appearance of Santa in Wilmont by arriving by plane, and Wilmont appreciates his keeping abreast of the times. Many local businesses and citizens donated money to make it possible for Santa to distribute candy and goodies to the children of this community.

Wilmont aviators have laid out a private air field recently. Fabian Scholtes and Alfred Balk, who together own a light monoplane temporarily hangered at the Worthington municipal airport, are solving, unaided, the question of a landing field in the village of Wilmont. They have laid out an L-shaped field on the Joseph Scholtes farm on the north edge of Wimont, the shortest leg a quarter-mile in length. The flight strips are within walking distance of town and have been thoroughly disked, packed, and leveled. Worthington fliers, visiting the field, say it will soon be as good as the present one in Worthington.

Funeral services were held at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church on Friday morning Dec. 15th, for Mrs. Chris Broich who passed away at her home here Wednesday morning. Burial was made in the Wilmont Cemetery. Pall bearers were N. D. Bertrand, John Schettler, Henry Lenz, Lawrence Balk, Peter Spartz, and Frank Reuscher. Catherine Nepper was born January 27, 1862 at St. Marion, Wis. On February 7, 1888 she was married to Chris Broich at Wiley, Iowa. Following their marriage they moved to Wilmont Township where they lived for four years on their prairie farm. They returned to lowa then and again moved back to Wilmont in 1901 and settled in the new village of Wilmont, which has since been their home. Mrs. Broich has been practically bedridden for some time, having suffered a fractured hip and left arm in December of last year. She had reached the age of 83 years. Surviving, besides her husband, are three sons and three daughters. They are Nic and J. J. Broich of Wilmont and John Broich of Sleepy Eye, Mrs. Paul Sommerfield of Canby, Mrs. D. A. Keller of Aberdeen, S. Dak. and Mrs. N. K. Hazard of Long Beach, Cal. A fourth son, Christie, preceded his mother in death in 1942. Also surviving are a brother, Chris Nepper of Alliance, Neb. and a sister, Mrs. John Reicks of Raville, Neb. Heartfelt sympathy is extended to the Broich family.

The Wilmont second team started the fourth quarter and Iona made 7

points and the Wilmont second team didn't get any. The final score was 44 to 13.




