



Photo From the Past

Received a call from Glen Pacholl about the picture in the last Shopper issue of the Phillips 66 Station on Hwy. 266 in Wilmont. Glen's uncle, John Pacholl owned this station at one time. John Pacholl and his brother, Frank, went some place and left Glen and his older brother, Jr. (Francis), and Bud Pacholl (John's son) run the station while they were gone. Jr. and Bud started horsing around and ended up breaking one of the big windows in the front of the station. They quickly went uptown to Hilly Galles's hardware store and bought some new glass to replace the window. They got it replaced and even threw a little dust on it to make it look dirty before John and Frank got back. They also swore Glen, who was six years younger, not tell anyone about the whole incident. In the end, though, the cook for Fr. Steger saw them replacing the window and told John Pacholl all about it. Glen laughed and said, You could never get by with anything in a small town.'

The photo this week is of the priest's house when it sat on the corner where the present OLGC Church now stands. It shows 3, maybe 4, nuns walking in back (the west side) of the priest's house, probably on their way to the school. The small part of a building on the left side is the original church. The school was on the opposite (north) side of the church.
