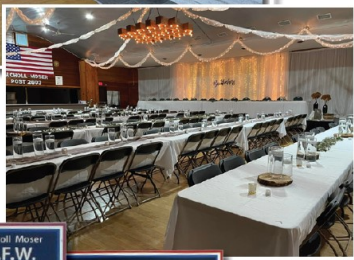
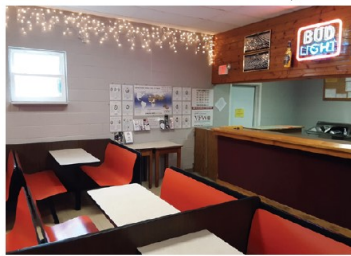

Desmond Dawood Malecek, 91, of Sacred Heart, died Thursday, October 26, 2023, at the RenVilla Health Center in Renville.

Desmond Dawood Malecek was born on May 30, 1932, in Flora Township, Renville County to Thomas and Marie (Schmidt) Malecek. He grew up on the family farm south of Renville and attended country school and then farmed his grandmother's farm from 1949 until 1954. After moving to Redwood Falls, he managed a Standard Oil Service Station until 1955. Desmond then moved to Sacred Heart and purchased a service station there. He was united in marriage to Judith Gerde on June 10th, 1956, at Trinity Lutheran Church in Sacred Heart. They made their home in Sacred Heart and Desmond operated the station until 1980. Following the sale of the station, he was employed by Amoco Fertilizer. In 1984 Desmond changed to assisting the operations of Perry Farms until his retirement. He was a member of Our Savior's Lutheran Church and served as treasurer. He also served on the Sacred Heart Fire Department and Sacred Heart Lions Club. Desmond loved working on cars, taking Sunday afternoon drives with his family, fishing, playing cards and having coffee with his friends.



Wilmont

Edwin Jueneman writes from Texas: January 9, 1945 Dear Pete, I get your paper every week, and it's really good to read the hometown paper down here in Texas. How is everybody out there? I bet it's pretty cold sometimes. The weather down here is pretty good. We had quite a bit of rain last week and when it starts raining here, it don't know when to quit. We really had a long trip on the way down here. I would have sooner stayed in Kansas than this camp here. They really know how to keep a guy busy in the infantry.

We got four weeks of our training done. We are on the rifle range now and how my ears are ringing tonight. Last Sunday us guys got a pass and went to town and is that ever some town. It's only three miles from Camp Hood. There is another town by the name of Belton that is about the size of Worthington. I guess that is a pretty good town. We got 15 weeks of basic training. I really will be glad to have the drilling done. Boy, that's really stiff. I hear a lot of boys from Wilmont are in 1-A. They really are taking them. I met Ray Lonneman Sunday in church and was really surprised to see him. It seems as thou everybody is coming down here because it's the infantry replacement center. One thing about this Texas climate, I can really sleep nights. We get up at four in the morning and get in about seven, that's only when we walk out to the rifle range. Junior and Vic Kontz are together in the same barracks. We were pretty lucky the whole gang staying together like that. A couple of weeks ago I talked to Jupe Middendorf and Milo Hurlbut. They are only about seven blocks from us. Did you have a good Christmas and New Years? We had a pretty good Christmas. I was on KP all day. ha, ha Sunday I met Edwin Jensen. I looked at him and thought I saw him before. So he was down Sunday all day. He is stationed at North Camp Hood. Well, Pete, I have no more news, so will close now and thanks for the paper. As ever, Ed Jueneman

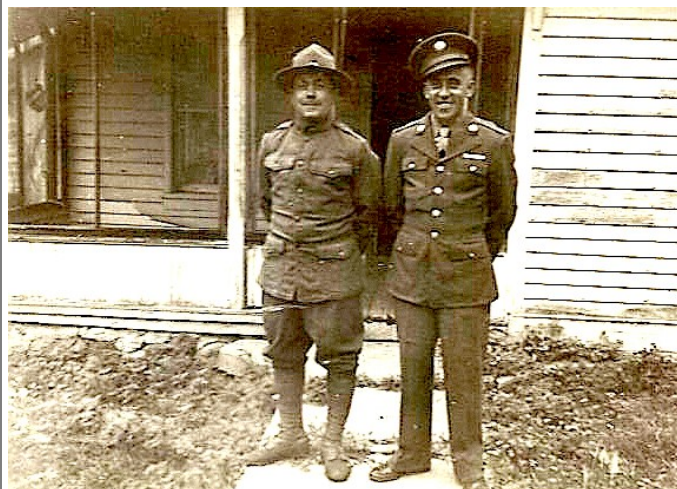
