





Wilmont

Sgt. Bernard Sieve Writes to Brother From Philippines: Sunday, Feb. 11, 1945 - Dear Al & Iva, I hardly know where to begin this letter since it's such a long time ago since my last letter to you. Things have really changed for me since that last pre-Christmas letter, but I suppose Helen has kept you informed of the main things and that is that I'm still hale and hearty, though wiser by experience. I've been here a month now and during that time have seen a bit of action in various degrees. Although I have been in danger at times, I've always manage to come out unscathed. I always try to get my fox hole deep enough and that seems to be the best insurance against the Nips. Have seen many, many dead Japs, a few live ones and then of course some of our boys get hurt too sometimes. However, the ratio is beyond comparison and though I've been tempted to take the press reports on dead Nips with a grain of salt, I believe every word of it now. They're taking a pretty bad beating here, so it seems. I guess the Lord is still taking care of us. There's no need denying it, we do need help sometimes, but it lasts only a few hours at a time usually. I've found the nights can get pretty darn long over here but the dawn always brings a new day and something to be thankful for. The Native Philippines have proved quite interesting and helpful in a lot of ways. They try to help wherever they can, even to digging our foxholes. A good 75% can either speak English or understand it. Some are hard to understand, but we get along. They're nuts about education and some are quite well schooled. One man summed up the history of the Philippines in three sentences - the Spanish brought us religion - The Americans brought us education - and the Japs brought us hunger! The latter is true as the preceding two sentences. I guess the Japs took anything they wanted in the line of food and clothing, either with pay or without. They made it a habit to hide all their clothes when they see a Jap patrol coming down the road. Their invasion money was so inflated that a shirt worth 2 pesos before the war would cost 1000 pesos after the Japs arrived. A box of matches, 50 pesos. I was told by a native that a postal clerk would receive 1000 pesos a day and couldn't get along on it in Manila. The common laborer would receive about 4 pesos a day. Though the Japs may have robbed them in the past, we knocked them (the Japs) out of several million bushels of rice, ready to be threshed. It looks like a bumper crop and stacked up resembling our grain stacks except smaller. It's the wheat of the Orient so it seems. Poverty reigns supreme here, but I'm sure after a few years they'll be back to normal again. Their farming methods are ancient. Using the old Oriental plow pulled by a Carabao in their rice paddies 2-wheeled wagons or carts drawn by a tiny horse or the ugly Carabao is their means of travel. However, before the war, some had automobiles. Yes., everything is strange here but nice. Being of Spanish decent and culture, the physical statue of the people resembles the Mexicans. They're about 97 % Catholic and fervent believers, too. Went to a Filipino church this morning. Mass said by our own Fr. Dietz. The church had been bombed or shelled, not directly, but some of it was in pretty bad shape. Their Padre was or still is in a Jap internment camp but they've preserved all the vestments, altar statues, etc. They'd maintained their choir. So far the first time since Mother's Day I heard a high mass. A very nice girl's choir at that. It was pretty touching to see the Philippines come to church in their finest Spanish style clothes (which had been hidden for about 2 years) kneeling beside the soldiers in work clothes, helmets and rifles. Fr. Dietz was deeply touched and asked the soldiers to donate a little something for the restoration of the church. They came

through in true American charity, two huge plates heaped with bills ranging from 1 to 20 pesos! The church is built of bamboo with a steel roof, cement floor and furnished with the least necessities. So we probably donated enough to restore it completely and nobody hurt. They are good people, they ask for so little and receive less. I'm afraid the dog-faces will eventually spoil them though since they have plenty of money and are hungry for chicken, eggs, melons or whatever they have to sell. I could write pages and pages on the subject, but this is to give you some idea what I'd like here. The day when I can get reacquainted with my family and relatives again is a little ways off yet I'm afraid. I've got almost 12 months in overseas, but it does't mean anything. At least, this campaign has brought me a little closer to home, so to speak. We have been giving them hell here and one day in particular, I witnessed a beautiful battle, very much one-sided. When the smoke cleared not one vehicle or tank got thru and we had a nice toll of Nips too. They're crafty and suicidal but no match for our power so it seems. And I may add they display utter stupidity at times. The Guerrillas brought in a prisoner yesterday and what tickled me is that they had him bowing to them instead of the reverse. They had been cuffing him around a bit so it seems. I'm comparatively safe all the time but have occasion to get in a hot spot at times. But, this is the kind of warfare I've been trained in so it's not too bad in general. I stay healthy as a cat and manage to get along on what they feed me. Don't worry about me and give my love to all the Sieve's and Springman's. I hope to see all of you before next Xmas, which I think is a pretty safe bet. I'll write to someone up there when I can but my letters may be few. Bye for now, From Ben Sieve

Mrs. Lloyd Balk had word that her husband, who is stationed at Fort Riley, Kansas, is confined to a hospital with an attack of influenza.

Carol Sieve has returned to his station at Great Lakes, Illinois after spending several days furlough with his mother, Mrs. Clem Sieve and other relatives.

Mrs. Virgil Balster and Florence Balster have returned home from Minneapolis where they went to visit with the former's husband, who was inducted into the Navy recently and left from there for the Great Lakes Naval Station.
