The CPR/AED class offered at the Wilmont VFW on 1-31-24 had 53 attendees. 14 of those attending chose to get certified in CPR. We had 5 people from the Wilmont Fire Dept on hand to help with the class and 2 other new members of the fire dept were there to get certified. The fire department also demonstrated the use of a Lucas Device which are now carried in our area ambulances. Many of those that attended had never had a CPR/AED class before. Others were there for a refresher on what to do in an emergency or to learn how to use an AED. The class was taught by Sarah Lenz, an EMS Instructor for EMS Custom Education. Nobles 2 Wind Farm Advised Fund and Southwest Initiative Foundation provided grant funds to support this important class for our area through the VFW.

"TESTIFY: Americana from Slavery to Today," is currently on display through the end of March at the Nobles County Heritage Center, 225 Ninth St., Worthington.

"TESTIFY" is a traveling rendition of an exhibit based on African-American artifacts and artworks from a collection assembled by retired Minnesota Supreme Court justice and former Minnesota Viking Alan Page and his late wife, Diane Sims Page.

The original full exhibit, coordinated by Alan Page's daughter, Georgi Page-Smith, was produced in 2018 and most recently was on display at the Minneapolis Central Library. The traveling version was conceived as a way to share the "TESTIFY" experience with more people across Minnesota. It is a large-format photo display of 17 panels with high-quality photographs of specific items in the Pages' collection, along with historical background and QR codes that connect viewers to audio recordings about each object.

Nobles County Historical Society is supplementing the exhibit with some local items from the NCHS collection.

To showcase this exhibit, NCHS will have a Happy Hour-type reception from 5 to 6:30 p.m. Feb. 22 at the Heritage Center. Beverages and appetizers will be served, and the event is open to the public.The exhibit can also be viewed during open museum hours through the end of March or by special arrangement for groups.





Mr. and Mrs. John Spartz had a letter from their son, Alfred Spartz, who is working n the Aleutian Islands, saying he met his cousin, John Hartman, recently Borth were surprised to see each other as neither knew of their whereabouts.

This is part of a letter from Pfc. Margaret Stuntebeck, WAC, to her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Stuntebeck. She is stationed somewhere in England. She writes, "I suppose elections are heavy, but these are unusual times, too. War and bombings really blast buildings and land into a mess. There are too many civilians hurt for these countries to take care of all their own people. Even their service people are badly cared for after years of fighting. Our enlisted personnel receive as much pay as a good many of the officers in the Allied Armies. Tell the people to go to church and thank God they're in the U.S.A. and don't have to go out in their gray headed days to scrub floors for a living, thru no fault of their own. Life in an orphanage isn't ideal either, especially after the fright of bombings and lack of supplies to care for the youngsters. It is pathetic to see these school age kids look at ice cream and wonder what it is. Yes, they are beginning to serve it again. Thinking of you". Marge.






