What could be finer for the farmers than to sell their hogs to a local buyer. Elsewhere you will find the markets in this issue.

On Monday evening the gang from the country defeated the team of Wilmont by a score of 3 - 1. The boys from the country got three runs, five hits, and made four errors. There was only one strikeout on both sides. The village got one run, two hits, and made one error. This makes one game apiece for these two teams and the

championship game will be played very soon. Jimmy Slater got the hit for the boys that really won the game in the second inning scoring two runs. The second game the same evening Wilmont was again defeated by a score of 7 - 6 by the Rushmore team. They were held scoreless until the sixth inning when three runs crossed home plate on two hits. Four runs in the seventh on four hits won the game. It was dark when the game was finally over. Wilmont scored four in the fourth and two in the sixth on six hits. Wilmont had seven hits and Rushmore had 10 hits.

Tuesday evening's game proved to be another fast and exciting game between Bloom Twp. and Summit Lake Twp. Summit Lake defeated Bloom by a score of 2 - 1. Each team was held to five hits. Summit Lake scored their two runs in the fifth on two free passes and two hits by L. Smith and W. Miller. Bloom scored their only run in the second when, with one down, F. Balster walked, stole second, and came flying home on Ivan Rogers single to right center.

On Monday evening, June 11, Bloom Twp. and Wilmont Twp. will play off the tie that was held here some time ago. This game will get underway at 7:45 sharp. Coming game June 7 for Westside Twp. and Wilmonot Twp. June 8th for East side and Larkin Twps.

Because of the decreased military demand for strike-on-box matches, a limited quantity of this type, commonly called "Penny Box Matches" will be available for civilian needs in the third quarter. 
