




Photo From the Past

Since we just had Memorial Day this week to remember our fallen veterans, the photo this week is of a group of Nobles County men who were registrants for Army duty. They left the court room in Worthington and boarded a bus for Des Moines, Iowa where they would be inducted in the Army on March 5, 1942. Among these 31 men was Cletus Broich (4th one from the left in the second row) from Wilmont, son of Mr. and Mrs. Nic Broich. He went overseas just after the invasion of France. He receive his training and was in the Coast Guard until just before he was killed, when he was assigned to the infantry in preparation of the drive. He was killed in action at the Battle of St. Lo on July, 12, 1944. We remember these men who gave the utmost so that we can live in a country where we have the freedom to do almost anything we want to do. God bless them.
