Take from February 7, 1946 Wilmont Tribune

Richard Kuhl, Seaman 3-c, who has just finished his boot training at San Diego, California spent a 5-day leave with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Kuhl. He returned there Monday.

Arthur Sibell has returned home from Camp McCoy where he received an honorable discharge from the Army. Here he joined his wife, the former Jeanetta Hoffman and daughter, Joyce, in the Joe Hoffman home. After a few days visit with relatives here, the Sibells will go to Alexandria to visit with his parents and other relatives.

Six servicemen from one family is guite a record. They are the sons of Mr. and Mrs. John Duclos of Freeport, Illinois and grandsons of Mrs. Frances Hoffman of our city. They are S-Sgt. Anthony Duclos who entered the service in October, 1942 and received his training at Camp Halifax, Cal. He was stationed in New Mexico and now is home with his wife and sons after 3 years in service. John Duclos entered service in March, 1943 and received his basic training at Farragut, Idaho. Cpl Joseph Duclos entered service in January, 1941 and received his training at S. Louis, Mo. He is now home after serving 3 1/2 years overseas. In September, 1941 he was married to Edna Breswick at Manchester, England. Henry Duclos entered service on December 8, 1941 and received his training at Great Lakes, Ill. Later he joined the Seaman Guards and was transferred to San Diego, Cal. and later received a medical discharge. Edwin Duclos entered service November 14, 1944 and received his basic training at Great Lakes, III. as a Seabee and is now stationed in Okinawa. Lawrence Duclos entered service in August, 1942. He receive his basic training in Great Lakes, Ill. He is a gunner mate third class and was on the U.S.S. Chicago which was sunk after which he ws put on the U.S. S. North Carolina. He took part in the battles of Saipan, Guam, the Coral Sea and Marianas. He is now on the U.S. S. North Carolina somewhere in the South Pacific. The parents live on a forty-acre farm north of Freeport and have 13 children. They were former residents of Wilmont, having lived here about 25 years.

Wednesday morning saw no change in the weather, and it was really going to town. Two employees of the Interstate Power Co. of Fulda were stranded here Tuesday night and are still here at this writing. No mail this morning and by the looks of it, no mail today. Monday's rain and ice made the streets and sidewalks almost impossible to walk on. Some people were seen crawling to a building to get back on their feet again. After all, why complain, lucky no one was caught out all night that is from here.

Photo From the Past

The photo this week was taken inside the Wilmont Municipal Liquor Store which was located in the former Balster Electric Building on the west side of main street. In December of 1939 The Wilmont city council decided to operate a municipal liquor store. In January of 1940 the council appointed a committee to try to lease a building and take applications for a manager. The council had 19 applications and on February 22, 1940, they held a special meeting and decided to hire Joe Hebbelman as manager and Jack Probst as assistant manager. The city bought out Matt Michael's liquor stock and moved the liquor store into this building and ran the business from here until 1945. Jack Probst became the manager in 1941 and held this position for 30 years, retiring in 1971. On the left is Joe Hebbelman and on the right is Jack Probst.

It is with a heavy heart that we announce the passing of Carolyn Graf, age 77. She passed away peacefully on June 14, 2025 at her home in Portland Oregon.

Carolyn was born August 10, 1947 in Nobles County Minnesota, the daughter of Gaylord Graf and Dorothy Graf. She attended elementary and intermediate school in Brewster, and graduated from Brewster High School with the class of 1965. After high school Carolyn studied at Minnesota State University Mankato, and graduated with her Bachelor of Science in Sociology/Psychology. Carolyn was an ardent supporter of Habitat For Humanity, and volunteered numerous hours building houses for those in need. Through Habitat, she learned many construction skills, including: framing, siding, flooring, roofing, hanging doors & windows, and painting. From an early age, she participated regularly with the Daughters of the American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary. Volunteering at the TAC rummage sale in Worthington, MN. was one of her favorite volunteer activities. Since the early 1980's, Carolyn taught Sunday School at various Lutheran Churches. Always the family historian, she took a great interest in mapping out her family tree. Her favorite leisure activities were: swimming, sewing, gardening, picnics, and spending time with family.

Carolyn is survived by her husband (Don), two sons (Edward and Joseph), two sisters (Luana and Deanna), a nephew (Tony), and niece (Arika). She was preceded in death by her beloved mother (Dorothy Graf), father (Gaylord Graf), and two sisters (Janine and Nadine).
