

Personal property taxes are due Thursday, February 28. You can pay them at the First National Bank here to avoid a penalty of 8% March 1st.

A testimonial dinner was given in honor of Mr. Mike Cruit in Minneapolis Monday evening, February 18th, by the Minneapolis Park Board where Mike has been employed for nearly 35 years. The dinner was followed by a program and music by Harry Anderson and his band. Mr. Cruit has handed in his resignation and we think that after serving a firm that long, a nice vacation would be in store.

During the past week, footings in excess of a million dollars were reached by the First National Bank of Wilmont. Their December

31st statement gave some interesting facts of deposits over the 46-year period: Dec. 31, 1900 - \$31,000; Dec. 31 1920 - \$167,000; Dec. 31, 1940 - \$200,000, and Dec. 31, 1945 - \$862,000.
