

As a State Ambassador, Quinn will participate in leadership training, plan statewide 4-H events, and serve as a role model and mentor to younger members.





At the baseball meeting held here Monday evening, a fine turnout was present. W. J. Sievers opened the meeting with the results of the Worthington meeting. From then on it was open for discussion from everyone. A motion was made and seconded to have the ball team get in the Gopher League. Elmer Kuhl was appointed manager by a motion made, seconded, and carried. Let's all get behind the team and send them places this summer.

At the Gopher League baseball meeting held at Fulda Thursday evening, the following teams entered into the Gopher League: Brewster, Hadley, Heron Lake, Lakefield, Wilmont. Westbrook withdrew from the league at this meeting and Iona will be in this league. All teams present stated that they will have a good team this year and some very fast pitching, which will be well worth seeing. P. L. Frekelberg of Brewster was elected President of the league, B. H. Crossinger of Hadley as league Vice-President, and E. L. Meyer of Wilmont as Secretary/Treasurer. At this meeting the group drew up a new set of by-laws for the league and the playing schedule for the season. The first games of the season will see Wilmont at Lakefield on Sunday, May 5th, Heron Lake at Brewster, and Hadley at Iona.

Photo From the Past
