Mr. and Mrs. Frank Lonneman received a letter from their son, T-4 Ray Lonneman, Monday stating that Lloyd Balk and Ray Hoffman came to see him on Sunday, March 17. From Ray's camp they all went to see Art Remakel who joined them in sightseeing around Tokyo, Japan.

Mr. and Mrs. Matt Gerber had a telegram last Thursday from the War Department stating that their son, HCpl. Donny Gerber, was seriously ill and confined to a hospital in Germany. No other particulars were given except that a letter would follow.

Maynard Stuntebeck arrived home Monday from India after receiving an honorable discharge. Maynard spent over three years in the service of which half of that time was spent overseas.

The sealed bids that were called for Thursday, March 21 were opened at that meeting with 3 bidders present. F. O. Tessem of Robbinsdale was awarded the contract for \$23,640.05. This bid includes curb, gutter, grading, removal of cross walks, installation of catch basins, furnishing and installing 12 inch sewer pipe and 545 feet of trench excavation and other minor items. Mr. Tessem informed the council that he will start about the middle of April, if weather permits, and will be completed about July 1st. After this job is completed, it will be ready for oil after a month of traveling and packing. When the complete job is done, Wilmont will have one of the finest streets in this part of the state.

A farewell party was given in honor of Marna and Ramona Perry at the home of their grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Nic Broich, on Thursday afternoon, March 14 when fourteen little girls came to see them before they left for their new home. The next day Mr. and Mrs. Perry, Ramona, and Marna left for Newton, Iowa where they will live.

Wilmont, one of the 13 Nobles County communities, donated \$309.05 from donations at auction sales to the total of \$1,967.52 collected in Nobles County for the Polio Drive. This money will be used within the county for care and treatment of those afflicted with Infantile Paralysis and hospitalization at the Kenny Institute.

At the Village Council regular meeting on March, 19th Fred &

Melvin Driessen, Virgil Viessman, Matt Kremer and Jack Carey were present at the meeting to see if it were possible to have the street oiled to the end of the Viessman home. A motion was made and seconded that the village of Wilmont oil the street north of the tracks and that all residents agreed to put in curb and gutter in front of their places. Another motion was made and seconded to hire Al Bremer as second man at the Wilmont Municipal Liquor Store at \$125 per month. Both motions were carried.

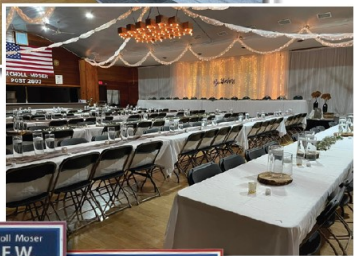
