





Rev. and Mrs. E. W. Corbit arrived in Wilmont on Thursday morning of last week and are now located in the Presbyterian manse. Rev. Corbin is pastor of the Wilmont and Reading churches. The Corbits come from Oakes, North Dakota, where they have resided for the past 6 years, where Rev. Corbit was pastor of the First Presbyterian Church. They expect their son, Lt. Robert Corbit, recently discharged from the U.S. Naval Air Corps, to arrive this week from Key West, Florida where he has been stationed at the Night Fighter base since his return from the Pacific area last June. He will spend some time at home. A daughter, Marion, HA I Class is in the WAVE's stationed at the U.S.N. Hospital at Chelsea, Mass. Another daughter lives at Winthrop, Minn., where her husband is a principal of the High School. The oldest daughter lives in Oregon, where he husband is superintendent of schools at Parkdale.

Funeral services were conducted by the Rev. E. W. Corbit at the Wilmont Presbyterian Church on Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock for Mrs. Toale Peterson, who passed away at her home here on Wednesday morning, April 19th. Bertha Marie Bjerke was born in Kalbi, Norway on September 9, 1882. When a young woman she married Toale Peterson in Kalbi, Norway on June 11, 1882. A few years later, in the spring of 1899 they came to this locality and settled at Iona, Minnesota on a farm where they lived for several years. Later, they farmed near Wilmont and the past few years they have lived in town, where Mrs. Peterson passed away after a two-week illness. To this union eight children were born, two preceding her in death. They are besides the husband, (Martha) Mrs. Ole Olson of Tyler; (Bertha) Mrs. August Bergland of Iona; Peter of Balaton; Halton of Lynd; Bert and Palmer of Wilmont. There are 31 grandchildren and 22 great-grandchildren. Also surviving are two sisters and four brothers. They are Mrs. John Dysthe of Iona; Mrs. Andrew Gilbertson of Chandler; John Bjerke of Norway; Ole Bjerke of Clear Brook; Magnus Bjerke of Chandler and Peter Bjerke of Kansas. Mrs. Peterson was 82 years old at the time of her death. Her children were all present at the time of her passing except one who was ill at the time. Following services here the remains were taken o Chandler where services were also held after which burial was made in the Chandler cemetery.

The past two Sundays the boys were out practicing and prospects look good for a real team this year. If weather permits, there will be a practice game at the local diamond on Sunday, April 21st. Come out and watch the boys in action.



A-E Cross Country Beats Storms as Multiple Runners Medal

Kevin Rivera was next for the Dragons who had a strong race of his own, battling throughout to place 8th in 17:43. Micah Bullerman did very well on the day, too, running a great race in 21:28 over the 4,000 meter course at 22nd place. Kataniya Hernandez had an improvement from the previous meet, racing in 23:27 for 25th place.

The varsity races showed improvements from almost everyone compared to the first meet. Olivia Bullerman led the A-E girls once again, running 22:39 and placing 16th of 58. Lucy Thier was 19th place in 22:59 to have a good second race performance. Keyona Klingenberg was solid, placing 24th in 23:56. Peyton Bohlke arguably had the best 5k of her career, running 24:38 and Jozie Cuperus was the 5th Dragon running 24:57. Abby Bertrand conquered the course in 28:14. The girls placed 3rd as a team.

Darwin Demarrias-Jansma built once again on last week's performance to place 11th at 18:28, nearly a 30 second improvement from the meet prior. Cody Weidert was the second runner for A-E in 21:19 to place 40th of 79. Ben Brinkhous nearly set a personal best in 21:48 with a blazing finish to place 50th. Riley Spies had a great race, running 23:07 while Angel Farias clocked 25:23 in a big jump from last week. The Dragons placed 9th as a team. The Dragons will return at the Worthington Turkey Trot on Thursday, September 11th.
