
She was a member of the Bethel Presbyterian Church in Reading. She enjoyed camping, fishing, music, family & friends and just having fun.


# Deputy Logan Waldner

Bob Slater arrived home Saturday from Wold Chamberland Field where he received his discharge from the Navy. Bob has been in the service for nearly 3 years.

Dr. Noethe, local veterinarian for the past 15 years, has announced the sale of his practice and home to Dr. and Mrs. K. G. Onken of Ames, Iowa. Dr. Noethe will carry on with his local practice until the middle of July when Dr. Onken expects to be here to take charge. Dr. and Mrs. Onken are well known in the Rushmore territory, having been a resident of that community for a number of years. Mrs. Onken will be remembered as Ann Meinders. Dr. Onken comes highly recommended by Iowa State College. Dr. and Mrs. Noethe recently purchased a new home in Slayton and will move there this summer. Dr. Noethe expects to resume his practice after a long-needed vacation. Being an ardent admirer of Hereford cattle, Dr. Noethe also states that he intends to start a registered herd of Herefords on his farm in Murray County.

This week Wilmont has lost one of our most highly respected businessmen when Mr. C. W. Becker retired from the lumber business and sold out his interests to his son, Max Becker. We all agree, that after serving Wilmont and the surrounding territory for the past 46 years, Mr. Becker is certainly entitled to a muchneeded rest. Mr. Becker started the lumber business here over 46 years ago when Wilmont was just beginning to get started and has faithfully served the people and given his time and energy ever since. Thanks, C. W. for the many years you have given to Wilmont.

Another deal was completed in our city last week whereby Emil Johanning bought out the William S. Brake interest, known as the Brake and Johanning Garage and Implement Shop. Possession was given immediately. The garage will now be known as Johanning Bros. Garage and Implement Shop. Emil, a veteran, who spent over three years in the service, will be on the job to meet all customers, as was customary with the former partner. William Brake states that taking care of his farms and other business kept him busy most of the time and decided to discontinue with the garage and implement business. A lot of business places have changed hands in our village the past 5 years. New faces are seen in nearly all the business places on main street during that time.

A deal was completed here Monday afternoon whereby William Boecker rented his locker plant to Teddie Voss and Clem Schlichte, possession was given Wednesday morning, May 1. Mr. Boecker states that being unable to get help and since he was severely burned last winter, he is unable to handle his line of work. Clem Schlichte is no new man at the locker plant business, having worked here for William Boecker and also at Kellen's Locker at Llismore. The men stated that they will be on the job and give the public the best of service at all times. We wish them the best.

Victor H. Voss, formerly of Wilmont, today announced the purchase, effective last Monday, of the Barrier Tire and Recapping

firm. Voss was discharged from service on February, 1945, after seven years in the Navy. Since that time he has worked with a local firm here in Worthington. 


#### Dragons Run at Pipestone Invitational"
