

Wilmont

S. 1c. Alvin Probst arrived home Monday from San Francisco to spend his leave at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Probst. Alvin will report back to the Great Lakes Naval Station after which he will receive his discharge.

May 2 - The opening game for the Wilmont baseball club will be played at the local ball park in Willmont on Sunday, May 12th when the fast Iona club will be here. Manager Kuhl of the local team will have a good team in the field this year and promises the baseball fans some real fast baseball. Duane Gibson of Havelock, Iowa will be on the mound for Wilmont in the opening game with Manager Kuhl at the receiving end. Mr. Gibson come here all recommended for the mound work. Considerable work has been done at the ball park the past month and it will be in tip-top shape for the opening game.

May 9 - The local team won the initial game here Sunday from lona by a score of 14 to 12. Several hundred fans turned out for the game. Wilmont started out with a bang in the first inning when two runs crossed home plate on hits by Scholtes, Cosgriff, and Kuhl. The locals scored 10 runs in the fourth and two in the eighth. Gibson, on the mound for Wilmont, was relieved by B. Kuhl in the fourth inning and went the route for the remainder of the game. Wilmont had 14 hits, 14 runs, and 5 errors. Iona had 12 runs, 10 hits and two errors. On Sunday Heron Lake will be at the local diamond. Players for Wilmont are O. Kuhl ss. C. Scholtes cf, L. Baker 3b, Cosgriff rf, E. Kuhl c, C. Springman If, Schlichte 2b, Probst 1b, Gibson p, B. Kuhl p, B. Sievers rf, and C. Majeres 2b.

Esther Slater became the wife of Alfred Becker on Tuesday morning, May 14th, 1946 at 9 o'clock at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church with the Rev. Urban Buchheit officiating. Mrs. Leo Spartz played the organ and was assisted by the choir. Maid of Honor was Arlene Slater of Worthington, sister of the bride. Charles Lenz, uncle of the groom, was best man. The bride is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Slater of Wilmont and the groom is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Casper Becker, also of Wilmont. The reception for 140 guests was held at the home of the bride's parents. The newlyweds left for northern Minnesota on a 2-week trip and will be home on a farm south of Wilmont after June 1st. Best wishes are extended them by a host of friends here.

A deal was completed the first of the week when Joe F. Balster bought the Matt Michels building, formerly occupied by the Municipal Liquor Store. Mr. Balster plans to operate a new Electric Appliance store, and he will open as soon as appliances are available in any quantity. Mr. Balster will handle the Kelvinstar Line of which he has had the dealership for the past 8 years, in that time selling a large number of stoves and refrigerators. At the present Joe is running a wiring crew.

At the regular meeting of the Village of Wilmont, Joe Probst was granted a permit to build a house and garage in the Village of Wilmont on Outlet S.

A deal was made on Monday of this week whereby Pete Heinrichs bought the Frank Balster Sr. house in the south part of town. The Heinrichs family has lived there for the past six years. Mr. and Mrs. Jack Carey received word Friday that Mr. Carey's uncle, Frank Morgan, had passed away. The Carey's left on Sunday for Storm Lake, Iowa where the funeral was held on Monday. The Morgans are former Wilmont residents, having lived here years ago. Mr. Morgan was in the restaurant business and later operated a General Store. He built the store where the Liquor Store is now located. He was 76 years old at the time of his death.

The VFW Boat drawing, which was supposed to be held on Wednesday, May 15th, will be delayed until Sunday afternoon, May 19th. The drawing will take place at the Wilmont ball park during the ball game here. The veterans were notified the first of the week that the boat would not arrive until the latter part of this week, and they decided to have the drawing Sunday afternoon. Be at the ball park and see for yourself who gets the boat.


