



Scholtes doubled, Baker singled scoring Scholtes and Elmer Kuhl doubled scoring Baker. Gibson was on the hound for the locals and stuck out 16 Lakers. On Memorial Day, May 30th, the local ball team will play Iona at Iona. On Saturday the locals will meet the Worthington first team at the Farmers' Picnic at Rushmore.

Bloom started the ball rolling in the first inning and scored in every inning but the fourth. Griffith was the heavy hitter for Bloom. Larkin scored 3 runs in the second 2 in the third, and 1 in the fifth, and 1 in the sixth. Friday evening Wilmont Twp. defeated Summit Lake Twp. by a score of 6 to 5. The hitting star for Wilmont Twp. was D. Hartman. The hitting stars for Summit Lake were W. Miller and A. Baker. Monday evening the West Siders defeated Larkin Twp. by a score of 4 to 0. Majeres, pitching for the West Siders, struck out 9. H. Boots was on the mound for Larkin.

Dragons Complete Season in Madison, MN

The Dragons traveled to Madison, MN, a two hour drive, to compete in the Section 3A Championship. This is the qualifying meet for state. To qualify, the two teams on the boys and girls team move on, while the next six individuals NOT on those teams will qualify as individuals. The Dragons were looking to have some of their best performances of the season to try their luck at qualifying or, at the very least, ending the season on a high note.

The Varsity boys ran first. The 5,000 meter course is pretty flat and fast and the weather was something of a dream in Madison during late October. The boy's got out fast and continued to pass runners along the way. Darwin Demarrias-Jansma led the team one final team as he placed 20th out of 137 runners in a time of 17:52. He was four places away from qualifying, which was a great effort on his end. Freshman Aiden Lichter crushed a personal best run to run 19:17 and placing 44th. Cody Weidert had another personal best run in 19:44 and placed 55th. Senior Ben Brinkhous in 19:56, a personal best. Riley Spies, another senior, ran a personal best in 20:56 to place 84th. Kevin Rivera ran 21:23 for a best time. Angel Farias had a season best time of 22:40. The Adrian-Ellsworth boys place 8th of 20 complete teams with 261 points, their lowest team total at Sections in 11 years.

On the girl's side, a team effort was the theme. Olivia Bullerman led the team with a time of 22:04 to place 36th of 125. Lucy Thier was 39th in 22:12, a season best time. Jozie Cuperus was close as well, running 22:15 for a season best time. Keyona Klingenberg finished the 5K with one shoe, but still ran 22:31 for 47th place. Peyton Bohlke was 70th place in 22:39. Abby Bertrand had a personal best time of 24:01 and placed 83rd. The girl's team placed 8th as well in the Section with a team score of 217. This is the lowest team score the Dragons have had in 14 years.


