



As soon as Bernard's feet touched the ground and he could walk, his love for farming and agriculture began. Driven by a strong work ethic and a deep respect for the land, he dedicated his life to mastering the art and science of agriculture, from planting and cultivating crops to raising cattle. Saying he loved to farm does not nearly describe Bernard's passion for agriculture and farming. Besides the love of his family, he was always happiest seeing the sunrise as he fed his cattle in the morning and seeing the sunset after a hard day's work.

About 1,611 men and women of Nobles County who, up to April 1, 1946 because of World War II had entered military service, have now passed through the various separation centers and are again civilians.f This means that about 74% of the county's service people have been discharged.

The Rev. Fr. Buckheit performed the ceremony. The altar boys wer the nephew, Walter Stuntebeck, and her cousin, Eldon Hoffman. Frances Pryatel, sister of the bridegroom attended the bride. Victor Stuntebeck, brother of the bride, was the bridegroom's attendant. At noon a dinner was served to 40 guests. After a trip to northern Minnesota the couple will be at home in Minneapolis where C. M. M. Pryatel is stationed at Wold-Chamberlain Field.

Marie Ann Einck, daughter of Mrs. Henry Einck became the bride of Cyril J. Fury, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Fury of Kinbrae in a ceremony at Out Lady of Good Counsel Church Monday morning at 8:30. The Rev. W. Raymond Redder of Adrian officiated at the Nuptial High Mass. Ida Lous Einck, sister of the bride, served as maid-of-honoe and John W. Fury, twin brother of the bridegroom was best man. Following the ceremony at the church a reception was held at the bride's home where covers were laid for 65 guests. After a short wedding trip, the couple will be at home at Iona.

Reading No. 1 kittenball players emerged from the county 4-H kittenball tournament at Rushmore Tuesday with the county championship in their grasp. Westside was the runner-up in the contest, which engaged 18 teams. A total of 17 games were played to decide the championship team. 100 players were active at one time on the five diamonds. Wilmont North Stars were defeated in the first round by Summit Lake.

The Farmer's Union picnic held Saturday at Rushmore was a big success. The weather was ideal with a large crowd on land. After the main address by Mr. Mitchell from the Central Exchange of St. Paul, The St. Paul's All-Girl Drum and Bugle Corps, all decked out in their green and white uniforms, proved the spectators with two fine performances. Worthington shut out Wilmont 3 to 0 in the featured ball game of the day.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday, June 8, at 9 o'clock for Herman Olberding, 65, at St. Anthony Church with Rev. M. J. Hiltner conducting the Requiem High Mass. Burial was made in the St. Anthony Cemetery. Mr. Olberding died suddenly of a heart attack at his home. Herman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Barney Olberding was born February. 23, 1881 at Arcadia, Iowa He attended school there and business college at Dennison, Iowa. In 1904 he came to Lismore where he entered the general merchandise store business, which he operated until 1940. In January, 1907 he married Louis Halverson who died in August, 1909 after the birth of their second daughter. Mr. Olberding was very active in


