## YEARS AGO—written by Audrey Brake— Thanks Audrey for all these memories!

Taken from the July 25 & August 1, 1946 Wilmont Tribune

### Wilmont

Work is progressing on the new theatre building being erected here by G. Green and crew of Worthington for Paul Sieve. The building will be 25 by 110 feet long and made of concrete blocks, constructional style. It is expected the first picture will be shown around September 1st. The new post office building being erected by the Breuer Brothers of Adrian and Bigelow for William Boecker is also gong up in good shape. It is a 24 by 40 font structure, made of concrete block. The completing of this building will be done by Henry Stuntebeck. These two buildings will add greatly to the appearance of our city.

A deal was completed here Tuesday of this week whereby E. C. Olson and H. L. Gerischer of Fairmont became owners of the E. A. Brown Elevator, formerly owned by the E. A. Brown Co. of Luverne. Possession was given at once. Mr. Olson is well known here having managed that elevator for a number of years until the family moved to Fairmont a few years ago. The new owners appreciate the past patronage given the E. A. Brown Co. and hope for its continuance. LeRoy Hindt will remain as manager.

A deal was made last week Friday whereby Henry J. Ahmann, who operated the Corner Cafe for the past 2 years, sold out to Louis Pinto of Worthington. Possession was given on Saturday morning. We regret to see Mr Ahmann leave this community and hope him the best of luck. We welcome Mr. and Mrs. Ponto to our city and with them the best in their business.

The V.F.W. Auxiliary will hold an ice cream social in Wilmont on Saturday evening, August 3rd. Your patronage will be appreciated.

The Root Rooter Sewer Service of Minneapolis arrived here Tuesday afternoon and on Wednesday morning started cleaning the sewer in our city.

Wilmont lost the first game of a 3-game series at the local ball park Sunday. Hadley defeated the locals by a score of 3 to 1. The buttermilk boys scored all three of their runs in the 1st inning. The locals got their only run of the game in the sixth inning. Scholtes, first man up, struck out, Shelquist tripled to left field and came home on E. Kuhl's single for the first and only run of the game. Faber on the mound for the locals allowed 3 hits, 3 runs and struck out 8 men. Wilmont made 3 errors. The locals had their chance in the ninth inning when Joe Probst, pinch-hitting for Schlichte, singled, L. Kuhl singled. It looked as though the boys would come through. Gerber flied out to left field, Baker was out pitcher to first, advancing Probst to third ad Kuhl to second. With two down, Faber struck out to end it all. On Sunday July 28th, the locals will go to Hadley for the second game of a 3-game series. If our boys don't win, it will be all over for them. If our guys win, Hadley will return here on Sunday, August 4th for the final game. Let's all go to Hadley Sunday and root for victory.

Manager Elmer Kuhl and his colts took Hadley into camp Sunday at Hadley in the second game of the series and won 7 to 1 before one of the largest crowds seen on the Hadley diamond for some time. Wilmont scored 4 runs in the second, 1 run in the fourth and

2 runs in the fifth. L. Kuhl led the power by getting two triples and one single. Scholtes also got a triple and doubled. Faber on the mound for the locals allowed four hits, one run, (unearned) and struck out 10 buttermilk boys. Wilmont completed 3 double plays in the game. With one game apiece for these two teams, the final one will be played here in Wilmont on Sunday, August 4th, when Hadley will be here. Make sure you are there to witness the game. Iona beat Brewster to win their series and will have a bye on Sunday and be waiting to see who they get in the final Gopher League game of Hadley and Wilmont.





Despite once declaring he would never marry a teacher, Dick fell in love with Alice Korn, and after a short courtship prompted by the upcoming silo filling, the two were married in 1972. Together, they were perfect partners, working side by side to raise four children on the farm. Their life together was built on teamwork, shared values, plenty of laughter, and deep respect for one another.

Dick took great joy in his grandchildren and followed their lives and activities with pride. He loved to tease them and was especially known for keeping candy hidden in his pocket, always ready to share a sweet treat and a smile. His grandchildren affectionately called him "Papa Teaser." Time spent with them brought him immense happiness, and his love for them was felt in both big moments and small traditions. He also enjoyed playing pinochle and was often suspected of cheating—an accusation he met with a grin and the claim that he was "not sure of the rules." His hearty laughter and gentle teasing will be fondly remembered.

He was a devoted member of St. Adrian Catholic Church and lived his faith quietly but strongly. His beliefs guided his life and sustained him through both hard years and good ones. In addition to his faith, Dick was committed to serving others, supporting farmers throughout the region by serving on various agricultural boards, and giving his time and leadership as a member of the church board at St. Adrian. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus; and the St. Josephs Society. He also served his country in the United States Army. His legacy lives on through his family, the farm he worked, and the values he passed down—hard work, faith, humility, service, kindness, and love. He will be deeply missed and lovingly remembered.
